1-19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-20 SECTION 1. The heading to Subchapter D, Chapter 58, Code of  
 1-21 Criminal Procedure, is amended to read as follows:

1-22 SUBCHAPTER D. CONFIDENTIALITY OF IDENTIFYING INFORMATION OF  
 1-23 VICTIMS OF STALKING, INVASIVE VISUAL RECORDING, OR INDECENT ASSAULT

1-24 SECTION 2. Article 58.151, Code of Criminal Procedure, is  
 1-25 amended to read as follows:

1-26 Art. 58.151. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "victim"  
 1-27 means a person who is the subject of:

1-28 (1) an offense that allegedly constitutes:

1-29 (A) stalking under Section 42.072, Penal Code;

1-30 (B) invasive visual recording under Section  
 1-31 21.15, Penal Code; or

1-32 (C) indecent assault under Section 22.012, Penal  
 1-33 Code; or

1-34 (2) an offense that is part of the same criminal  
 1-35 episode, as defined by Section 3.01, Penal Code, as an offense  
 1-36 described by Subdivision (1) [~~under Section 42.072, Penal Code~~].

1-37 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
