1-21 relating to exempting certain contracts from procurement notice
 1-22 requirements.

1-23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-24 SECTION 1. Section 2262.051(j), Government Code, is amended
 1-25 to read as follows:

1-26 (j) For a procurement in an amount that exceeds \$20 million
 1-27 [~~other than a contract entered into by the comptroller under~~
 1-28 ~~Section 2155.061~~], the guide must require a state agency to notify
 1-29 interested parties at least two months before the date the agency
 1-30 issues the solicitation for the procurement unless the procurement
 1-31 is for:

1-32 (1) a contract entered into by the comptroller under
 1-33 Section 2155.061; or

1-34 (2) a contract for services necessary to respond to a
 1-35 natural disaster.

1-36 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
 1-37 a contract for which a state agency first advertises or otherwise
 1-38 solicits bids, proposals, offers, or qualifications on or after the
 1-39 effective date of this Act. A contract for which a state agency
 1-40 first advertised or otherwise solicited bids, proposals, offers, or
 1-41 qualifications before that date is governed by the law in effect
 1-42 when the first advertisement or solicitation was given, and the
 1-43 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

1-44 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.

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
