## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

## AN ACT

2 relating to an optional designation on a driver's license or 3 personal identification certificate indicating that a person has a 4 hearing impairment.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Sections 521.060(a) and (c), Transportation 7 Code, are amended to read as follows:

The department shall maintain in its files a record of 8 (a) 9 the name, address, and telephone number of each individual identified by the holder of a driver's license or personal 10 11 identification certificate as an individual the holder authorizes 12 to be contacted in the event that the holder is injured or dies in or as a result of a vehicular accident or another emergency situation. 13 14 In addition, the department shall maintain in its files a record of any medical information described by Section 521.125(a) that is 15 provided to the department under Subsection (c) or any health 16 condition information that is voluntarily provided to 17 the department under <u>Sections 521.1251 and</u> [Section] 521.142(h). 18

(c) An application for an original, renewal, or duplicatedriver's license or personal identification certificate must:

21 (1) be designed to allow, but not require, the 22 applicant to provide:

(A) the name, address, and telephone number ofnot more than two individuals to be contacted if the applicant is

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1 injured or dies in a circumstance described by Subsection (a); and (B) in addition to health condition information 2 voluntarily provided under <u>Sections 521.1251 and</u> [Section] 3 521.142(h), medical information described by Section 521.125(a); 4 5 and 6 (2) include a statement that: 7 describes the confidential nature of the (A) information; and 8 9 states that by providing the department with (B) 10 the information, the applicant consents to the limited disclosure and use of the information. 11 12 SECTION 2. Subchapter F, Chapter 521, Transportation Code, is amended by adding Section 521.1251 to read as follows: 13 14 Sec. 521.1251. OPTIONAL HEARING IMPAIRMENT DESIGNATION. 15 (a) The department shall provide to each applicant for the issuance of an original, renewal, corrected, or duplicate driver's license 16 17 or personal identification certificate who applies in person, by mail, over the Internet, or by other electronic means the 18 19 opportunity to voluntarily indicate on a driver's license or personal identification certificate that the person has a hearing 20 impairment as evidenced by a written statement from a licensed 21 22 physician. 23 (b) The department shall include a designation that 24 indicates the person has a hearing impairment on each driver's license or personal identification certificate issued to a person 25 26 who: 27 (1) makes an election under this section; and

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1 (2) provides sufficient evidence under Subsection (a)
2 to qualify for the designation.
3 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
