- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 161, Health and Safety
- 6 Code, is amended by adding Section 161.01095 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 161.01095. PROHIBITED DISCRIMINATION BASED ON
- 8 VACCINATION STATUS; CIVIL PENALTY. (a) In this section, "health
- 9 care provider" means an individual or facility licensed, certified,
- 10 or otherwise authorized to administer health care, for profit or
- 11 otherwise, in the ordinary course of business or professional
- 12 practice. The term includes a physician.
- (b) Notwithstanding any other law, a health care provider
- 14 may not, based on an individual's vaccination status, deny or
- 15 refuse to provide the individual a health care treatment,
- 16 procedure, or service.
- 17 <u>(c)</u> A health care provider who violates this section is
- 18 subject to a civil penalty of \$50,000 for each violation. The
- 19 attorney general may bring an action to recover the civil penalty
- 20 and may recover attorney's fees and costs incurred in bringing the
- 21 action.
- 22 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
