3	districts.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. The heading to Section 285.081, Health and
6	Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
7	Sec. 285.081. OPTIONAL FOUR-YEAR TERMS.
8	SECTION 2. Subchapter G, Chapter 285 , Health and Safety
9	Code, is amended by adding Sections 285.082 and 285.083 to read as
10	follows:
11	Sec. 285.082. OPTIONAL THREE-YEAR TERMS. (a) The
12	governing board of a hospital district created under general or
13	special law may, on its own motion, order that the members of the
14	governing board are to be elected to serve staggered three-year
15	terms if:
16	(1) the members of the governing board serve staggered
17	four-year terms on the date the governing board enters the order;
18	and
19	(2) Subsection (b), (c), or (d) applies to the
20	governing board.
21	(b) This subsection applies to a governing board of a
22	hospital district with five members. The election of board members
23	in the even-numbered year following the date an order is entered
24	under Subsection (a) in which three board members are to be elected

1 shall be held as previously scheduled. Two of the members elected 2 at that election shall serve three-year terms, and one of the 3 members elected at that election shall serve a four-year term, to be determined by random draw. Board members elected in subsequent 4 5 elections shall serve three-year terms. 6 (c) This subsection applies to a governing board of a 7 hospital district with seven members. The election of board members 8 in the even-numbered year following the date an order is entered under Subsection (a) in which four members are to be elected shall 9 be held as previously scheduled. Two of the members elected at that 10 election shall serve three-year terms and two of the members 11 12 elected at that election shall serve four-year terms, to be determined by random draw. Board members elected in subsequent 13 elections shall serve three-year terms. 14 15 (d) This subsection applies to a governing board of a hospital district with nine members. The election of board members 16 17 in the even-numbered year following the date an order is entered under Subsection (a) in which five members are to be elected shall 18 19 be held as previously scheduled. Two of the members elected at that election shall serve three-year terms and three of the members 20 elected at that election shall serve four-year terms, to be 21 determined by random draw. The election of board members in the next 22 even-numbered year following the date an order is entered under 23 24 Subsection (a) in which four members are to be elected shall be held as previously scheduled. Three of the members elected at that 25 26 election shall serve three-year terms and one of the members elected at that election shall serve a four-year term, to be 27

1	determined by random draw. Board members elected in subsequent
2	elections shall serve three-year terms.
3	Sec. 285.083. RESIGNATION OF TERM. (a) A member of the
4	governing board of a hospital district is considered to have
5	resigned the member's position if the member is absent from five or
6	more regularly scheduled board meetings that the member is eligible
7	to attend in any 12-month period without an excuse approved by a
8	majority vote of the board.
9	(b) A resignation under Subsection (a) is effective on the
10	date of the fifth regularly scheduled board meeting at which the
11	member is absent without an excuse approved by the board.
12	(c) The validity of an action of the board is not affected by
13	the fact that the action is taken during a period in which a board
14	member is considered to have resigned under Subsection (a).
15	(d) This section does not apply to a hospital district
16	created under Chapter 281.
17	SECTION 3. Section 286.022(c), Health and Safety Code, is
18	amended to read as follows:
19	(c) The petition may provide:
20	(1) the number of directors for the district, which
21	number must be an odd number; [and]
22	(2) the method by which directors are to be elected,
23	whether at large, by place, or by a combination of both, so that a
24	specific number of directors are elected from each commissioner
25	precinct and a specific number are elected at large <u>; and</u>
26	(3) whether directors will be elected to serve
27	two-year or four-year terms.

SECTION 4. Section 286.025(a), Health and Safety Code, is
amended to read as follows:

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3 (a) The commissioners court shall give notice of the 4 election by publishing a substantial copy of the election order in a 5 newspaper with general circulation in the proposed district <u>in</u> 6 <u>accordance with Section 4.003, Election Code</u> [once a week for two 7 <u>consecutive weeks</u>].

8 SECTION 5. Section 286.041, Health and Safety Code, is 9 amended to read as follows:

10 Sec. 286.041. BOARD OF DIRECTORS. The directors shall be 11 elected <u>at large</u>, by place, or by a combination of both, in 12 accordance with the petition prescribed by Section 286.021.

13 SECTION 6. Section 286.042, Health and Safety Code, is 14 amended to read as follows:

Sec. 286.042. DIRECTOR'S ELECTION. (a) The initial directors shall be elected at an election to be held on the <u>uniform</u> <u>election date</u> [first Saturday] in May following the creation of the district.

19 (b) If the directors are elected at large <u>for two-year</u> 20 <u>terms</u>:

(1) the appropriate number of candidates receiving the highest number of votes at the initial election of directors are directors for the district;

(2) the number of directors equal to a majority of the
directors who receive the highest number of votes at the initial
election serve for a term of two years; and

27 (3) the remaining directors serve for a term of one

1 year.

2 (c) If the directors are elected by place <u>for two-year</u> 3 <u>terms</u>:

4 (1) the candidate for a place receiving the highest
5 number of votes for election to that place is a director for the
6 district;

7 (2) a director elected to fill an even-numbered place8 at the initial election serves for a term of one year; and

9 (3) a director elected to fill an odd-numbered place 10 at the initial election serves for a term of two years.

11 (d) If the directors are elected from commissioners 12 precincts and at large <u>for two-year terms</u>:

(1) the number of candidates equal to the number of directors to be elected from each precinct who receive the highest number of votes from a commissioner precinct are directors for that precinct;

17 (2) the number of candidates equal to the number of 18 directors to be elected at large who receive the highest number of 19 votes from the district at large are directors for the district at 20 large;

(3) a candidate elected from an odd-numbered precinct
at the initial election serves for a term of two years;

(4) a candidate elected from an even-numbered precinct
at the initial election serves for a term of one year;

(5) a candidate elected as the director from the district at large at the initial election serves for a term of two years; and

No. 3191 1 (6) if more than one director is elected at large, half of the directors elected serve two-year terms, and the other half 2 3 serve one-year terms. 4 (d-1) If the directors are elected at large for four-year 5 terms: 6 (1) the appropriate number of candidates receiving the 7 highest number of votes at the initial election of directors are 8 directors for the district; 9 (2) the number of directors equal to a majority of the directors who receive the highest number of votes at the initial 10 election serve for a term of three years if elected in an 11 12 odd-numbered year or four years if elected in an even-numbered year; and 13 14 (3) the remaining directors serve for a term of one 15 year if elected in an odd-numbered year or two years if elected in 16 an even-numbered year. 17 (d-2) If the directors are elected by place for four-year 18 terms: 19 (1) the candidate for a place receiving the highest number of votes for election to that place is a director for the 20 district; 21 (2) a director elected to fill an even-numbered place 22 at the initial election serves for a term of one year if elected in 23 24 an odd-numbered year or two years if elected in an even-numbered 25 year; and 26 (3) a director elected to fill an odd-numbered place at the initial election serves for a term of three years if elected 27

1	in an odd-numbered year or four years if elected in an even-numbered
2	year.
3	(d-3) If the directors are elected from commissioners
4	precincts and at large for four-year terms:
5	(1) the number of candidates equal to the number of
6	directors to be elected from each precinct who receive the highest
7	number of votes from a commissioner precinct are directors for that
8	<pre>precinct;</pre>
9	(2) the number of candidates equal to the number of
10	directors to be elected at large who receive the highest number of
11	votes from the district at large are directors for the district at
12	large;
13	(3) a candidate elected from an odd-numbered precinct
14	at the initial election serves for a term of three years if elected
15	in an odd-numbered year or four years if elected in an even-numbered
16	year;
17	(4) a candidate elected from an even-numbered precinct
18	at the initial election serves for a term of one year if elected in
19	an odd-numbered year or two years if elected in an even-numbered
20	year;
21	(5) a candidate elected as the director from the
22	district at large at the initial election serves for a term of three
23	years if elected in an odd-numbered year or four years if elected in
24	an even-numbered year; and
25	(6) if more than one director is elected at large, half
26	of the directors elected at large serve for a term described by
27	Subdivision (4) for a candidate elected from an even-numbered

1 precinct, and the other half serve for a term described by 2 Subdivision (3) for a candidate elected from an odd-numbered 3 precinct. 4 (e) After the initial election of directors, an election

5 shall be held on the <u>uniform election date</u> [first Saturday] in May 6 <u>of</u> each year <u>or every other year</u>, <u>as applicable</u>, to elect the 7 appropriate number of successor directors for two-year terms <u>or</u> 8 <u>four-year terms as specified in the petition to create the</u> 9 district.

SECTION 7. Section 286.043, Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 286.043. NOTICE OF ELECTION. <u>Notice</u> [Before the 35th day before the date of an election of directors, notice] of <u>an</u> [the] election shall be published [one time] in a newspaper with general circulation in the district <u>in accordance with Section 4.003</u>, <u>Election Code</u>.

SECTION 8. The heading to Section 286.044, Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:

19 Sec. 286.044. APPLICATION FOR PLACE ON BALLOT [PETITION].

20 SECTION 9. Section 286.044(a), Health and Safety Code, is 21 amended to read as follows:

(a) A person who wishes to have the person's name printed on
the ballot as a candidate for director must file an application with
the secretary of the board <u>in accordance with Chapter 144</u>, Election
<u>Code</u>.

26 SECTION 10. Section 286.053, Health and Safety Code, is 27 amended to read as follows:

H.B. No. 3191 Sec. 286.053. APPOINTMENTS TO STAFF. The board may: 1 2 appoint to the staff any <u>health care practitioners</u> (1)3 [doctors] the board considers necessary for the efficient operation of the district; and 4 5 (2) grant clinical privileges on a [make] temporary or emergency basis as [appointments] the board considers necessary. 6 7 SECTION 11. Section 286.078(b), Health and Safety Code, is 8 amended to read as follows: 9 The board may enter into a public work contract as (b) 10 authorized under Chapter 2269, Government Code [construction contracts that involve spending more than \$10,000 only after 11 12 competitive bidding as provided by Subchapter B, Chapter 271, Local 13 Government Code]. 14 SECTION 12. Section 286.101(f), Health and Safety Code, is 15 amended to read as follows: (f) [The election shall be held after the 45th day and on or 16 17 before the 60th day after the date the election is ordered.] The election shall be ordered and notice of the election shall be given 18 19 in the same manner as provided by Sections 286.024 and 286.025 for ordering and giving notice of an election authorizing creation of 20 21 the district. Section 41.001(a), Election Code, does not apply to an election held under this section. 22 SECTION 13. Section 286.102(c), Health and Safety Code, is 23 24 amended to read as follows: 25 (c) [The election shall be held not later than the 60th day 26 after the date the election is ordered.] Section 41.001(a),

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Election Code, does not apply to an election ordered under this

1 section.

2 SECTION 14. Section 286.129, Health and Safety Code, is 3 amended to read as follows:

Sec. 286.129. SPENDING AND INVESTMENT LIMITATIONS. (a) Except as provided by <u>Sections</u> [Section] 286.078(a), [and by <u>Sections</u>] 286.141, 286.144, and 286.145, and Chapter 315, the district may not incur a debt payable from revenues of the district other than the revenues on hand or to be on hand in the current and immediately following fiscal year of the district.

10 (b) The board may invest operating, depreciation, or 11 building reserves only in <u>investments authorized under Chapter</u> 12 2256, Government Code [+

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[(1) bonds of the United States;

14 [(2) certificates of indebtedness issued by the United 15 States secretary of the treasury;

16 [(3) bonds of this state or a county, municipality, or 17 school district of this state; or

18 [(4) shares or share accounts of savings and loan 19 associations organized under the laws of this state or federal 20 savings and loan associations domiciled in this state, if the 21 shares or share accounts are insured by the Federal Deposit 22 Insurance Corporation].

23 SECTION 15. Section 1023.054(a), Special District Local 24 Laws Code, is amended to read as follows:

(a) <u>If a</u> [A] vacancy <u>occurs</u> in the office of director, the
remaining directors shall appoint a director [shall be filled] for
the unexpired term [at the next regular election].

SECTION 16. Section 1070.111, Special District Local Laws
 Code, is amended to read as follows:

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3 Sec. 1070.111. CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTS. A construction 4 contract that involves the expenditure of more than \$10,000 may be 5 made only after advertising in the manner provided by Chapter 252, 6 Local Government Code, <u>or</u> Subchapter B, Chapter 271, Local 7 Government Code[, or Section 286.078, Health and Safety Code].

8 SECTION 17. The following provisions of the Health and 9 Safety Code are repealed:

10 (1) Section 286.023(g);

11 (2) Section 286.025(b); and

12 (3) Section 286.044(b).

13 SECTION 18. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
