A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the composition of the radiation advisory board. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 401.015(a), Health and Safety Code, is 4 5 amended to read as follows: The radiation advisory board is composed of the 6 (a) 7 following 18 members appointed by the governor: (1) one representative from industry who is trained in 8 nuclear physics, science, or nuclear engineering; 9 (2) one representative from labor; 10 11 (3) one representative from agriculture who is 12 licensed by the State Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners; 13 (4) one representative from the insurance industry; 14 (5) one individual who is engaged in the use and application of nuclear physics in medicine and is certified by the 15 American Board of Radiology or licensed by the Texas Medical Board 16 under Chapter 602, Occupations Code; 17 18 (6) one hospital administrator; 19 (7) one individual licensed by the Texas Medical Board 20 who specializes in nuclear medicine; 21 (8) one individual licensed by the Texas Medical Board 22 who specializes in pathology; (9) one individual licensed by the Texas Medical Board 23 24 who specializes in radiology;

No. 3236 1 (10)one representative from the nuclear utility 2 industry; 3 (11)one representative from the radioactive waste 4 industry; 5 (12) one representative from the petroleum industry; 6 (13) one health physicist certified by the American Board of Health Physics; 7 (14) one individual licensed by the State Board of 8 Dental Examiners; 9 10 (15)one representative from the uranium mining industry; and 11 three representatives of the public. 12 (16)SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act does not 13 affect the entitlement of a member serving on the radiation 14 15 advisory board immediately before the effective date of this Act to continue to serve for the remainder of the member's term. As the 16 17 terms of members expire, the governor shall appoint or reappoint members who have the qualifications required by Section 401.015, 18 Health and Safety Code, as amended by this Act. 19 20 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
