1-24 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
 1-25 AN ACT

1-26 relating to the locations of the campuses of the Texas State
 1-27 Technical College System.

1-28 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-29 SECTION 1. Section 135.02(a), Education Code, is amended to
 1-30 read as follows:

1-31 (a) The Texas State Technical College System is composed of:

1-32 (1) a system office located in the city of Waco in
 1-33 McLennan County;

1-34 (2) a campus located in [~~the city of Harlingen in~~]
 1-35 Cameron County;

1-36 (3) a campus serving West Texas that operates as a
 1-37 collective unit of strategically positioned permanent locations in
 1-38 [~~the city of Sweetwater in~~] Nolan County, [~~the city of Abilene in~~]
 1-39 Taylor County, [~~the city of Brownwood in~~] Brown County, and [~~the~~
 1-40 ~~city of Breckenridge in~~] Stephens County;

1-41 (4) a campus located [~~in the city of Marshall~~] in
 1-42 Harrison County;

1-43 (5) a campus located [~~in the city of Waco~~] in McLennan
 1-44 County;

1-45 (6) a campus located in Fort Bend County;

1-46 (7) a campus that operates as a collective unit of one
 1-47 or more locations [~~located in the city of Red Oak~~] in Ellis County;
 1-48 [~~and~~]

1-49 (8) a campus that operates as a collective unit of one
 1-50 or more locations in Comal County and Guadalupe County;

1-51 (9) a campus located in Denton County;

1-52 (10) a campus that operates as a collective unit of one
 1-53 or more locations in Williamson County east of State Highway 130 and
 1-54 Interstate Highway 35; and

1-55 (11) campuses assigned to the system from time to time
 1-56 by specific legislative Act.

1-57 SECTION 2. Section 130.063(e), Education Code, is amended
 1-58 to read as follows:

1-59 (e) This section does not prevent a junior college district
 1-60 from annexing territory located in Brown County, Comal County,

2-1 Denton County, Guadalupe County, or Williamson County.

2-2 SECTION 3. Section 135.04(b), Education Code, is amended to
2-3 read as follows:

2-4 (b) Before any program may be offered by a campus or
2-5 extension center within the tax district of a public junior college
2-6 that is operating a vocational and technical program, it must be
2-7 established that the public junior college is not capable of
2-8 offering or is unable to offer the program. After it is established
2-9 that a need for the program exists and that the program is not
2-10 locally available, the campus or extension center may offer the
2-11 program, provided approval is secured from the coordinating board.
2-12 Approval of technical-vocational programs under this section does
2-13 not apply to Brown, McLennan, Cameron, Fort Bend, Comal, Denton,
2-14 Guadalupe, Williamson, and Potter Counties [~~counties~~].

2-15 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
2-16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
2-17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
2-18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
2-19 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.

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
