## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the next generation 9-1-1 service fund.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 771.0713, Health and Safety Code, is
- 5 amended by amending Subsections (b), (f), and (g) and adding
- 6 Subsections (c-1), (c-2), and (c-3) to read as follows:
- 7 (b) Notwithstanding any other law and except as provided by
- 8 federal law, the comptroller shall transfer to the credit of the
- 9 next generation 9-1-1 service fund any amount available from
- 10 federal money provided to this state from the Coronavirus State and
- 11 Local Fiscal Recovery Funds under Section 9901 of the American
- 12 Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (Pub. L. No. 117-2) or from any other state
- 13 or federal governmental source for purposes of this chapter,
- 14 including money appropriated or otherwise credited to the fund.
- 15 The comptroller shall transfer the money as soon as practicable
- 16 following:
- 17 (1) the receipt by this state of a sufficient amount of
- 18 federal money for the transfer; or
- 19 (2) the effective date of the most recent legislative
- 20 appropriation for purposes of this chapter.
- 21 (c-1) Except as provided by Subsection (c-2), the
- 22 commission shall distribute from money appropriated to the
- 23 commission for purposes of this chapter to each emergency
- 24 communications district that does not participate in the state

- 1 system a portion of the appropriated money in an amount
- 2 proportional to the population of the area served by the district
- 3 compared to the population of this state.
- 4 (c-2) For each emergency communication district created
- 5 under Chapter 772 that is entitled to a portion of the money
- 6 distributed under Subsection (c-1), the commission shall:
- 7 (1) reduce the portion to which that district is
- 8 entitled by an amount equal to nine percent of that portion and
- 9 distribute that resulting amount in equal shares to all the
- 10 emergency communication districts created under Chapter 772; and
- 11 (2) distribute to that district the remainder of the
- 12 portion to which the district is entitled under Subsection (c-1)
- 13 that is not distributed under Subdivision (1).
- 14 (c-3) The remaining money appropriated to the commission
- 15 for purposes of this chapter that is not otherwise distributed
- 16 under Subsection (c-1) or (c-2) shall be deposited to the 9-1-1
- 17 services fee account.
- 18 (f) All money in the fund from the Coronavirus State and
- 19 Local Fiscal Recovery Funds under Section 9901 of the American
- 20 Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (Pub. L. No. 117-2) shall be distributed in
- 21 accordance with this section not later than August 31, 2024
- 22 [December 31, 2022], and all money distributed under this section
- 23 from the Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds under
- 24 Section 9901 of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (Pub. L.
- 25 No. 117-2) shall be spent not later than December 31, 2026 [ $\frac{2024}{1}$ ],
- 26 for the deployment and reliable operation of next generation 9-1-1
- 27 service.

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- 1 (g) This section expires December 31, 2028 [September 1, 2025].
- 3 SECTION 2. Section 771.079(b), Health and Safety Code, is
- 4 amended to read as follows:
- 5 (b) The account consists of:
- 6 (1) fees deposited in the fund as provided by Sections
- 7 771.071 and 771.0711; [and]
- 8 (2) money deposited to the account under Section
- 9  $\frac{771.0713(c-3)}{}$ ; and
- 10 (3) notwithstanding Section 404.071, Government Code,
- 11 all interest attributable to money held in the account.
- 12 SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act apply
- 13 beginning with the state fiscal biennium that begins September 1,
- 14 2023.
- 15 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
