A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the next generation 9-1-1 service fund.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

4 SECTION 1. Section 771.0713, Health and Safety Code, is

5 amended by amending Subsections (b), (c), (f) and (g) and adding

6 Subsections (c-1), (c-2), (c-3) and (c-4) to read as follows:

- 7 (b) Notwithstanding any other law and except as provided by
- 8 federal or state law, the comptroller shall transfer to the credit
- 9 of the next generation 9-1-1 service fund any amount available (i)
- 10 from federal money provided to this state from the Coronavirus
- 11 State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds under Section 9901 of the
- 12 American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (Pub. L. No. 117-2) or from any
- 13 other federal governmental source, or (ii) from any state
- 14 governmental source, for purposes of this chapter. The comptroller
- 15 shall transfer the money as soon as practicable following the
- 16 receipt by this state of a sufficient amount of federal money for
- 17 the transfer or as soon as practicable after the effective date of
- 18 the most recent appropriation of state funds by the legislature for
- 19 this purpose.
- 20 (c) Money deposited to the credit of the next generation
- 21 9-1-1 service fund may be used only for the purpose of supporting
- 22 the deployment and reliable operation of next generation 9-1-1
- 23 service, including the costs of equipment, operations, and
- 24 administration.

- 1 (c-1) Money in the fund from federal sources may be
- 2 distributed to only the commission and emergency communication
- 3 districts and must be used in a manner the complies with federal
- 4 law.
- 5 (c-2) For any money in the fund resulting from the
- 6 appropriation of state funds, except as provided by Subsection
- 7 (c-3), after the money is deposited into the fund, the commission
- 8 shall distribute to each emergency communication district that does
- 9 not participate in the state system a portion of the money that
- 10 bears the same proportion that the population of the area served by
- 11 the district bears to the population of the state.
- 12 (c-3) For each emergency communication district created
- 13 under Chapter 772 that is entitled to a portion of the money
- 14 distributed under Subsection (c-2), the commission shall:
- 15 (1) reduce the portion to which that district is
- 16 entitled by an amount equal to [nine percent] of that portion and
- 17 distribute that amount in equal shares to all the emergency
- 18 communication districts created under Chapter 772; and
- 19 (2) distribute to that district the remainder of the
- 20 portion to which the district is entitled under Subsection (c-2)
- 21 that is not distributed under Subdivision (1).
- 22 (c-4) The remaining money in the fund appropriated from
- 23 state funds that is not otherwise distributed under Subsection
- 24 (c-2) or (c-3) shall be deposited to the 9-1-1 services fee account.
- 25 (f) All money in the fund <u>from the Coronavirus State and</u>
- 26 Local Fiscal Recovery Funds under Section 9901 of the American
- 27 Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (Pub. L. No. 117-2) shall be distributed in

- 1 accordance with this section not later than [December 31, 2022]
- 2 August 31, 2024, and all money distributed under this section from
- 3 the Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds under Section
- 4 9901 of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (Pub. L. No. 117-2)
- 5 shall be spent not later than [December 31, 2024] December 31, 2026,
- 6 for the deployment and reliable operation of next generation 9-1-1
- 7 service.
- 8 (g) This section expires [September 1, 2025] December 31,
- 9 2026.
- 10 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
