4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 2308A, Government Code, is amended by
6	adding Section 2308A.0091 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 2308A.0091. ANNUAL REPORT REGARDING TWO-YEAR
8	INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION EMPLOYMENT AND WAGE OUTCOMES. (a)
9	In this section:
10	(1) "Average first-year wages" means the average
11	annual wages earned by a yearly cohort's graduates and leavers
12	during the first calendar year following the calendar year in which
13	those persons graduated from or were last enrolled in the

15 "Graduate" means a person who:

applicable two-year institution of higher education.

- 16 (A) has been awarded a degree or certificate from
- 17 a two-year institution of higher education; and
- 18 (B) is not determined by the coordinating board
- 19 for purposes of this section to be enrolled in another institution
- 20 of higher education.
- 21 (3) "Leaver" means a student who:
- (A) has completed at least nine semester credit
- 23 hours or the equivalent at a two-year institution of higher
- 24 education;

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1	(B) is no longer enrolled at the institution but
2	did not graduate; and
3	(C) is not determined by the coordinating board
4	for purposes of this section to be enrolled in another institution
5	of higher education.
6	(4) "Placement rate" in regard to a yearly cohort
7	means the proportion of the yearly cohort's graduates and leavers
8	determined by the coordinating board to be working in this state
9	during the first calendar year following the calendar year in which
10	the yearly cohort's members graduated from or were last enrolled in
11	the applicable two-year institution of higher education, expressed
12	as a percentage.
13	(5) "Transfer rate" in regard to an institution's
14	yearly cohort means the proportion of the yearly cohort's members
15	who are no longer enrolled in the institution but did not graduate
16	and are determined by the coordinating board for purposes of this
17	section to be enrolled in another institution of higher education.
18	(6) "Two-year institution of higher education" has the
19	meaning assigned by Section 54.751, Education Code.
20	(7) "Yearly cohort" means a cohort of students from a
21	two-year institution of higher education that includes, for a
22	<pre>calendar year, each:</pre>
23	(A) graduate who graduated from the institution
24	during that calendar year;
25	(B) leaver who last enrolled in the institution
26	during that calendar year; and
27	(C) student who last enrolled in the institution

- 2 the coordinating board for purposes of this section to be enrolled
- 3 in another institution of higher education.
- 4 (b) Not later than March 31 of each calendar year, the
- 5 coordinating board shall:
- 6 (1) determine, in consultation with the commission,
- 7 the most recent calendar year for which the entire calendar year's
- 8 unemployment insurance wage record data may be obtained from the
- 9 commission;
- 10 (2) obtain from the commission the unemployment
- 11 insurance wage record data for the calendar year identified in
- 12 Subdivision (1);
- 13 (3) collate the unemployment insurance wage record
- 14 data obtained under Subdivision (2) using the social security
- 15 <u>numbers for graduates and leavers in each two-year institution of</u>
- 16 higher education's yearly cohort for the calendar year immediately
- 17 preceding the calendar year for which the unemployment insurance
- 18 wage record data was obtained;
- 19 (4) use the unemployment insurance wage record data
- 20 collated under Subdivision (3) to determine the average first-year
- 21 wages and placement rate for each yearly cohort described by
- 22 Subdivision (3); and
- 23 (5) using enrollment data from all institutions of
- 24 higher education, determine the transfer rate for each yearly
- 25 cohort described by Subdivision (3).
- 26 (c) Not later than the first Monday of April of each year,
- 27 the coordinating board shall submit a report to each member of the

- 1 <u>legislature</u>, the <u>lieutenant</u> governor, the governor, the
- 2 comptroller, and the chief executive officer of each two-year
- 3 institution of higher education. The report must contain the most
- 4 recently available average first-year wages, placement rate, and
- 5 transfer rate of each two-year institution of higher education, as
- 6 determined by the coordinating board under Subsection (b).
- 7 <u>(d) The coordinating board shall:</u>
- 8 <u>(1) maintain copies of each report submitted under</u>
- 9 Subsection (c) in a manner that is accessible for public
- 10 inspection; and
- 11 (2) on the person's request, provide a copy of a report
- 12 maintained under Subdivision (1) to a member of the legislature,
- 13 the lieutenant governor, the governor, the comptroller, or the
- 14 chief executive officer of a two-year institution of higher
- 15 <u>education</u>.
- 16 (e) The coordinating board may adopt rules as necessary for
- 17 the administration of this section.
- SECTION 2. Section 130.0035(b), Education Code, is amended
- 19 to read as follows:
- 20 (b) The report must include the following information for
- 21 the junior college district for the academic year covered by the
- 22 report:
- 23 (1) the rate at which students completed courses
- 24 attempted;
- 25 (2) the number and types of degrees and certificates
- 26 awarded;
- 27 (3) the percentage of graduates who passed licensing

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- 1 exams related to the degree or certificate awarded, to the extent
- 2 the information can be determined;
- 3 (4) the number of students or graduates who transfer
- 4 to or are admitted to a public university;
- 5 (5) the passing rates for students required to be
- 6 tested under <u>former</u> Section 51.306;
- 7 (6) the percentage of students enrolled who are
- 8 academically disadvantaged;
- 9 (7) the percentage of students enrolled who are
- 10 economically disadvantaged;
- 11 (8) the racial and ethnic composition of the
- 12 district's student body; [and]
- 13 (9) the percentage of student contact hours taught by
- 14 full-time faculty; and
- 15 (10) the most recent average first-year wages,
- 16 placement rate, and transfer rate for the district's students
- 17 reported by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board in the
- 18 coordinating board's most recent report under Section 2308A.0091,
- 19 Government Code.
- 20 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
