1-19 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
 1-20 AN ACT

1-21 relating to employment activities of certain peace officers
 1-22 responding to an emergency call for purposes of the Texas Workers'
 1-23 Compensation Act.

1-24 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-25 SECTION 1. Section 401.026, Labor Code, is amended to read
 1-26 as follows:

1-27 Sec. 401.026. APPLICABILITY TO CERTAIN EMERGENCY RESPONSE
 1-28 PERSONNEL. For purposes of this subtitle, the travel of a
 1-29 firefighter, peace officer, or emergency medical personnel en route
 1-30 to an emergency call is considered to be in the course and scope of
 1-31 the firefighter's, peace officer's, or emergency medical
 1-32 personnel's employment.

1-33 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
 1-34 to a claim for workers' compensation benefits based on a
 1-35 compensable injury that occurs on or after the effective date of
 1-36 this Act. A claim based on a compensable injury that occurs before
 1-37 that date is governed by the law as it existed on the date the
 1-38 compensable injury occurred, and the former law is continued in
 1-39 effect for that purpose.

1-40 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
 1-41 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
 1-42 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
 1-43 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
 1-44 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
