A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the purchase and sale of vintage distilled spirits by
3	the holder of a package store permit or local distributor's permit.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 1.04, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is
6	amended by adding Subdivisions (30) and (31) to read as follows:
7	(30) "Vintage distilled spirits" means distilled
8	spirits that:
9	(A) are in the original manufacturer's sealed
10	container, including a bottle or case of bottles;
11	(B) are not owned by the holder of a distiller's
12	and rectifier's permit or the holder of a nonresident seller's
13	<pre>permit;</pre>
14	(C) are not otherwise available for purchase from
15	the holder of a wholesaler's permit;
16	(D) have not been offered for sale by the holder
17	of a wholesaler's permit within the preceding five years; and
18	(E) are possessed by a person in this state.
19	(31) "Vintage distilled spirits seller" means a person
20	who:
21	(A) is at least 21 years of age;
22	(B) does not hold a license or permit under this
23	<pre>code; and</pre>
24	(C) is:

- (i) an administrator, executor, receiver,
- 2 or other fiduciary who receives and sells vintage distilled spirits
- 3 in execution of the person's fiduciary capacity;
- 4 <u>(ii)</u> a creditor who receives or takes
- 5 possession of vintage distilled spirits as security for, or in
- 6 payment of, debt, in whole or in part;
- 7 (iii) a public officer or court official
- 8 who levies on vintage distilled spirits under order or process of
- 9 any court or magistrate to sell the vintage distilled spirits in
- 10 satisfaction of the order or process; or
- 11 (iv) any other person who does not hold or
- 12 have an interest in a permit or a license or in the business of a
- 13 permit or license holder under this code and is not engaged in the
- 14 business of selling alcoholic beverages.
- 15 SECTION 2. Section 22.01, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is
- 16 amended to read as follows:
- 17 Sec. 22.01. AUTHORIZED ACTIVITIES. The holder of a package
- 18 store permit may:
- 19 (1) purchase liquor in this state from the holder of a
- 20 winery, wholesaler's, or class B wholesaler's permit;
- 21 (2) purchase malt beverages in this state from the
- 22 holder of a general or branch distributor's license;
- 23 (3) sell liquor and malt beverages in unbroken
- 24 original containers on or from the holder's licensed premises at
- 25 retail to consumers for off-premises consumption only and not for
- 26 the purpose of resale, except that if the permittee is a hotel, the
- 27 permittee may deliver unbroken packages of liquor and malt

- 1 beverages to bona fide guests of the hotel in their rooms for
- 2 consumption in their rooms;
- 3 (4) sell vinous liquors in original containers of not
- 4 less than six ounces; [and]
- 5 (5) sell liquor to holders of passenger transportation
- 6 permits as provided in Section 48.03; and
- 7 (6) purchase and sell vintage distilled spirits as
- 8 provided in Section 22.19.
- 9 SECTION 3. Chapter 22, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is amended
- 10 by adding Section 22.19 to read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 22.19. PURCHASE AND SALE OF VINTAGE DISTILLED SPIRITS.
- 12 (a) The holder of a package store permit may purchase vintage
- 13 distilled spirits from a vintage distilled spirits seller.
- 14 (b) A vintage distilled spirits seller may sell to the
- 15 holder of a package store permit, for each permitted premises, not
- 16 more than 24 containers of vintage distilled spirits during any
- 17 12-month period.
- 18 (c) The holder of a package store permit shall maintain a
- 19 record of each purchase of vintage distilled spirits until the
- 20 second anniversary of the date the vintage distilled spirits are
- 21 purchased and provide the record to the commission on request. The
- 22 <u>record must include the following information:</u>
- (1) the permit holder's name, address, permit number,
- 24 and phone number;
- 25 (2) the vintage distilled spirits seller's name,
- 26 address, and phone number;
- 27 (3) the brand name and quantity of each vintage

- 1 <u>distilled spirits container purchased;</u>
- 2 (4) the date of the purchase; and
- 3 (5) the number of containers of vintage distilled
- 4 spirits the permit holder has previously purchased from the vintage
- 5 distilled spirits seller and the dates of those purchases.
- 6 (d) A package store permit holder may sell vintage distilled
- 7 spirits to consumers for off-premises consumption only and to
- 8 <u>holders of passenger transportation permits as provided in Section</u>
- 9 48.03.
- 10 (e) Any holder of a package store permit who is injured in
- 11 the permittee's business or property by a vintage distilled spirits
- 12 seller by the sale of forged, adulterated, or counterfeit vintage
- 13 distilled spirits to the permittee may institute suit in any
- 14 district court in the county in which the violation is alleged to
- 15 have occurred to require enforcement by injunctive procedures and
- 16 to recover triple damages plus costs of suit including reasonable
- 17 attorney's fees.
- 18 SECTION 4. Section 23.01(a), Alcoholic Beverage Code, is
- 19 amended to read as follows:
- 20 (a) The holder of a local distributor's permit may:
- 21 (1) purchase alcoholic beverages, including malt
- 22 beverages, from wholesalers and distributors authorized to sell
- 23 them for resale, but may purchase only those brands available for
- 24 general distribution to all local distributor's permittees;
- 25 (2) sell and distribute the alcoholic beverages,
- 26 including malt beverages, to mixed beverage and private club
- 27 registration permittees;

- 1 (3) sell and distribute distilled spirits to the
- 2 holder of a nonprofit entity temporary event permit; [and]
- 3 (4) rent or sell to mixed beverage and private club
- 4 registration permittees any equipment, fixtures, or supplies used
- 5 in the selling or dispensing of distilled spirits; and
- 6 (5) purchase and sell vintage distilled spirits as
- 7 provided by Section 23.07.
- 8 SECTION 5. Chapter 23, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is amended
- 9 by adding Section 23.07 to read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 23.07. PURCHASE AND SALE OF VINTAGE DISTILLED SPIRITS.
- 11 (a) The holder of a local distributor's permit may purchase vintage
- 12 distilled spirits from a vintage distilled spirits seller.
- (b) A vintage distilled spirits seller may sell to the
- 14 holder of a local distributor's permit, for each permitted
- 15 premises, not more than 24 containers of vintage distilled spirits
- 16 <u>during any 12-month period.</u>
- 17 (c) The holder of a local distributor's permit shall
- 18 maintain a record of each purchase of vintage distilled spirits
- 19 until the second anniversary of the date the vintage distilled
- 20 spirits are purchased and provide the record to the commission on
- 21 request. The record must include the following information:
- 22 (1) the permit holder's name, address, permit number,
- 23 <u>and phone number;</u>
- 24 (2) the vintage distilled spirits seller's name,
- 25 <u>address</u>, and phone number;
- 26 (3) the brand name and quantity of each vintage
- 27 distilled spirits container purchased;

- 1 (4) the date of the purchase; and
- 2 <u>(5) the number of containers of vintage distilled</u>
- 3 spirits the permit holder has previously purchased from the vintage
- 4 distilled spirits seller and the dates of those purchases.
- 5 (d) A local distributor's permit holder may sell to the
- 6 holder of a mixed beverage permit not more than six containers of
- 7 vintage distilled spirits during any 12-month period.
- 8 (e) Any holder of a local distributor's permit who is
- 9 injured in the permittee's business or property by a vintage
- 10 distilled spirits seller by the sale of forged, adulterated, or
- 11 counterfeit vintage distilled spirits to the permittee may
- 12 institute suit in any district court in the county in which the
- 13 violation is alleged to have occurred to require enforcement by
- 14 injunctive procedures and to recover triple damages plus costs of
- 15 suit including reasonable attorney's fees.
- 16 SECTION 6. Section 28.07(a), Alcoholic Beverage Code, is
- 17 amended to read as follows:
- 18 (a) All distilled spirits and vintage distilled spirits
- 19 sold by a holder of a mixed beverage permit must be purchased from a
- 20 holder of a local distributor's permit in the county in which the
- 21 premises of a mixed beverage permittee is located.
- 22 SECTION 7. Section 103.10, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is
- 23 amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 103.10. EXERCISE OF DISCRETION IN CASE OF MISTAKE. (a)
- 25 The preceding sections of this subchapter shall not be construed as
- 26 preventing the commission from exercising its discretion if illicit
- 27 alcoholic beverages are seized as the result of an accidental

- 1 shipment or other reasonable mistake. Under those circumstances,
- 2 the commission may issue orders and make disposition of the
- 3 alcoholic beverages as it finds just and reasonable.
- 4 (b) It is a defense to prosecution or to the imposition of a
- 5 civil or administrative penalty for a violation under this chapter
- 6 that:
- 7 (1) the holder of a package store permit or the holder
- 8 of a local distributor's permit:
- 9 (A) purchased an illicit beverage from a vintage
- 10 <u>distilled spirits seller under Section 22.19 or 23.07 in good</u>
- 11 faith;
- 12 (B) reasonably believed the illicit beverage was
- 13 vintage distilled spirits at all times the beverage was in the
- 14 permit holder's possession; and
- (C) sold the illicit beverage to an authorized
- 16 purchaser in good faith; and
- 17 (2) an authorized purchaser, to whom the holder of a
- 18 package store permit or local distributor's permit sold an illicit
- 19 beverage, reasonably believed the beverage was vintage distilled
- 20 spirits and not an illicit beverage.
- 21 SECTION 8. Section 201.08(a), Alcoholic Beverage Code, is
- 22 amended to read as follows:
- 23 (a) No tax may be collected on liquor:
- 24 (1) shipped out of state for consumption outside the
- 25 state; [or]
- 26 (2) sold aboard a ship for ship's supplies; or
- 27 (3) sold as vintage distilled spirits.
