1 AN ACT 2 relating to active shooter training for peace officers. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 1701.253, Occupations Code, is amended

5 by adding Subsection (q) to read as follows:

6 (q) As part of the minimum curriculum requirements, the commission shall require an officer to complete a training program 7 of not less than 16 hours on responding to an active shooter as 8 9 provided by the Advanced Law Enforcement Rapid Response Training Center at Texas State University--San Marcos, or a similar 10 organization approved by the commission. An officer shall complete 11 the program not later than the last day of the first full continuing 12 education training period that begins on or after the date the 13 14 officer is licensed under this chapter unless the officer completes the program as part of the officer's basic training course. 15 16 Completion of a training program under this subsection satisfies any other requirement for the officer to complete a training

17 program on responding to active shooters, including under Section 18

19 37.0812(a), Education Code.

20 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date of this Act, the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement shall adopt 21 rules to implement Section 1701.253(q), Occupations Code, as added 22 23 by this Act.

SECTION 3. The minimum curriculum requirements 24 under

- 1 Section 1701.253(q), Occupations Code, as added by this Act, apply
- 2 only to an officer who first begins to satisfy those requirements on
- 3 or after January 1, 2024.
- 4 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
