A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the regulation of certain transactions involving oil 3 and gas tubing. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Section 1956.001, Occupations Code, is amended by adding Subdivision (7-a) and amending Subdivision (10) to read 6 as follows: 7 (7-a) "Oil and gas tubing" means steel pipe with a 8 nominal outside diameter between one inch and eight inches and a 9 total length of 10 feet or longer, commonly used in the process of 10 drilling and completing oil and gas wells. 11 12 (10)"Regulated metal" means: 13 manhole covers; (A) 14 (B) quardrails; 15 (C) cylinders designed metal to contain compressed air, oxygen, gases, or liquids;

- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (b) The advisory committee consists of $\underline{16}$ [$\underline{15}$] members
- 8 appointed by the director as follows:
- 9 (1) one representative of the department;
- 10 (2) two representatives of local law enforcement
- 11 agencies located in different municipalities, each with a
- 12 population of 500,000 or more;
- 13 (3) two representatives of local law enforcement
- 14 agencies located in different municipalities, each with a
- 15 population of 200,000 or more but less than 500,000;
- 16 (4) one representative of a local law enforcement

- 7 under Section 1956.017, Occupations Code, as amended by this Act,
