A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the transfer of certain real property from the Texas
- 3 Transportation Commission to Palo Pinto County.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. (a) Not later than January 1, 2024, the Texas
- 6 Transportation Commission shall transfer to Palo Pinto County all
- 7 or part of the real property described by Section 2 of this Act. The
- 8 property transferred shall be sufficient to serve the purposes
- 9 described by Subsection (b) of this section.
- 10 (b) The consideration for the transfer authorized by
- 11 Subsection (a) of this section is the requirement that Palo Pinto
- 12 County use the property transferred only as an area for motor
- 13 vehicle scales used by and motor vehicle inspections conducted by
- 14 Department of Public Safety inspectors or other authorized weight
- 15 enforcement officers for purposes of enforcement of Chapter 621,
- 16 Transportation Code, or a successor statute, a purpose that
- 17 benefits the public interest of the state. If Palo Pinto County no
- 18 longer uses the property as described by this subsection, ownership
- 19 of the property automatically reverts to the Texas Transportation
- 20 Commission.
- 21 (c) The Texas Transportation Commission shall transfer the
- 22 property by an appropriate instrument of transfer that:
- 23 (1) includes a provision that:
- 24 (A) requires Palo Pinto County to use the

- 1 property as an area for motor vehicle scales used by and vehicle
- 2 inspections conducted by Department of Public Safety inspectors or
- 3 other authorized weight enforcement officers for purposes of
- 4 enforcement of Chapter 621, Transportation Code, or a successor
- 5 statute, a purpose that benefits the public interest of the state;
- 6 and
- 7 (B) indicates that ownership of the property
- 8 automatically reverts to the Texas Transportation Commission if
- 9 Palo Pinto County no longer uses the property for that public
- 10 purpose; and
- 11 (2) describes the property to be transferred by metes
- 12 and bounds.
- 13 (d) All contracts, leases, and other obligations governing
- 14 the real property transferred as authorized by this Act in effect on
- 15 the effective date of this Act are transferred to Palo Pinto County.
- 16 (e) Sections 31.158 and 31.159, Natural Resources Code, do
- 17 not apply to the transfer of real property authorized by this Act.
- 18 SECTION 2. The real property to which Section 1 of this Act
- 19 applies is only the property included in the following description
- 20 that is located in the S. Botsford Survey, Abstract 2164, in Palo
- 21 Pinto County, Texas:
- 22 BEING a called 6.820 acres, more or less, and being out of the
- 23 following described two tracts of land conveyed by A. B. Gilbert and
- 24 wife, Helen Gilbert to the State of Texas, acting by and through the
- 25 State Highway Commission, by Deed dated July 18, 1966, recorded in
- 26 Volume 336, Page 557, Deed Records of Palo Pinto County, Texas.

1 TRACT ONE:

- 2 BEING 4.014 acres of land, more or less, situated in the County of
- 3 Palo Pinto, State of Texas, and being out of the S. Botsford Survey,
- 4 Abstract No. 2164, and being a part of a tract of land conveyed to A.
- 5 B. Gilbert by will recorded in Volume 22, Page 394 thru 395 of the
- 6 Probate Minutes, Palo Pinto County, Texas, which 4.014 acres of
- 7 land, more or less, is more particularly described as follows:
- 8 BEGINNING at a point in the existing southeasterly right of way line
- 9 of U.S. Highway 80, said point being North 42 deg. 50 min. East a
- 10 distance of 6.55 feet from the most northerly northwest corner of
- 11 said A. B. Gilbert's tract that lies southerly of U.S. Highway 80;
- 12 THENCE North 42 deg. 50 min. East with the existing southeasterly
- 13 right of way line of said U.S. Highway 80 a distance of 2,400.00
- 14 feet to a point in the proposed southeasterly right of way line of
- 15 Interstate Highway 20, said point being 225.00 feet southeasterly
- of and at right angles to centerline survey station 1334+00.00;
- 17 THENCE in a southwesterly direction with said proposed right of way
- 18 line along the arc of a circular curve to the left having a radius of
- 19 2,824.79 feet, and through a central angle of 13 deg. 00 min. 00
- 20 sec. a distance of 640.92 feet to a point;
- 21 THENCE South 29 deg. 50 min. West continuing with said proposed
- 22 right of way line a distance of 228.04 feet to a point;
- 23 THENCE in a southwesterly direction continuing with said proposed
- 24 right of way line along the arc of a circular curve to the right
- 25 having a radius of 1,472.39 feet and through a central angle of 25
- 26 deg. 00 min. 00 sec. a distance of 642.45 feet to a point;
- 27 THENCE South 54 deg. 50 min. West continuing with said proposed

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- 1 right of way line a distance of 324.81 feet to a point;
- 2 THENCE in a southwesterly direction continuing with said proposed
- 3 right of way line along the arc of a circular curve to the left
- 4 having a radius of 2,824.79 feet and through a central angle of 12
- 5 deg. 00 min. 00 sec. a distance of 591.62 feet to the point of
- 6 beginning.
- 7 TRACT TWO:
- 8 BEING 48.804 acres of land, more or less, situated in the Counties
- 9 of Palo Pinto and Parker, State of Texas, and being out of the A.
- 10 Issac Survey, Abstract No. 728, Palo Pinto County, and Abstract No.
- 11 2165, Parker County, and the S. Botsford Survey, Abstract No. 31,
- 12 Parker County and Abstract No. 2164, Palo Pinto County, and being a
- 13 part of a tract of land conveyed by Billy H. Jones to A. B. Gilbert
- 14 by deed dated September 5, 1961 and recorded in Volume 295, Page
- 15 498, of the Deed Records, Palo Pinto County, Texas, and being also a
- 16 part of a tract of land conveyed to A. B. Gilbert by Will recorded in
- 17 Volume 22, Page 394 thru 395 of the Probate Minutes, Palo Pinto
- 18 County, Texas, which 48.804 acres of land, more or less, is more
- 19 particularly described as follows:
- 20 BEGINNING at the most Easterly corner of the A. B. Gilbert tract
- 21 that lies Northwesterly of U.S. Highway 80, said point being in the
- 22 existing northwesterly right of way line of U.S. Highway 80.
- 23 THENCE South 42 deg. 50 min. West with said existing Northwesterly
- 24 right of way line of U.S. Highway 80 a distance of 5,098.89 feet to a
- 25 point in the East line of the Ella Gilbert tract;
- 26 THENCE North 00 deg. 39 min. East with the East line of said Ella
- 27 Gilbert's tract a distance of 521.32 feet to a point in the proposed

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- 1 Northwesterly right of way line of Interstate Highway 20, said
- 2 point being South 00 deg. 39 min. West a distance of 98.87 feet from
- 3 the Northeast corner of said Ella Gilbert's tract;
- 4 THENCE with said proposed Northwesterly right of way line of
- 5 Interstate Highway 20 the following courses and distances:
- North 42 deg. 50 min. East a distance of 105.04 feet to a
- 7 point;
- 8 North 34 deg. 18 min. East a distance of 335.18 feet to a
- 9 point;
- North 22 deg. 21 min. East a distance of 286.64 feet to a
- 11 point;
- North 13 deg. 17 min. East a distance of 172.41 feet to a
- 13 point;
- North 28 deg. 50 min. East a distance of 325.67 feet to a
- 15 point;
- North 37 deg. 59 min. East a distance of 331.86 feet to a
- 17 point;
- North 66 deg. 40 min. East a distance of 211.29 feet to a
- 19 point;
- North 64 deg. 05 min. East a distance of 356.59 feet to a
- 21 point;
- 22 THENCE in a Northeasterly direction continuing with said proposed
- 23 right of way line along the arc of a circular curve to the left
- 24 having a radius of 1,869.86 feet and through a central angle of 21
- deg. 15 min. 00 sec. a distance of 693.50 feet to a point, said point
- 26 being 225.00 feet Northwesterly of and at right angle to centerline
- 27 survey Station 1342+00.00;

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- 1 THENCE North 42 deg. 50 min. East continuing with said proposed
- 2 right of way line a distance of 2,007.84 feet to a point in the
- 3 Northeasterly line of A. B. Gilbert's tract;
- 4 THENCE South 47 deg. 07 min. East with the Northeasterly line of
- 5 said A. B. Gilbert's tract a distance of 350.00 feet to the point of
- 6 beginning.
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
