## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the administration of certain oaths and the taking of

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Article 2.06, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 Art. 2.06. <u>DISTRICT AND COUNTY ATTORNEYS</u> MAY ADMINISTER
- 8 CERTAIN OATHS. (a) In this article, "electronic broadcast system"
- 9 has the meaning assigned by Article 15.03.
- 10 (b) For the purposes of this chapter and Chapters 1, 15, and
- 11 21, a [purpose mentioned in the two preceding Articles,] district
- 12 <u>or [and]</u> county <u>attorney is [attorneys are]</u> authorized to
- 13 administer an oath [oaths].
- 14 <u>(c) A district or county attorney may administer an oath as</u>
- 15 <u>authorized</u> by this article either in person or through an
- 16 electronic broadcast system.
- 17 SECTION 2. Chapter 15, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
- 18 amended by adding Article 15.052 to read as follows:
- Art. 15.052. SWEARING OF COMPLAINTS. (a) In this article,
- 20 <u>"electronic broadcast system" has the meaning assigned by Article</u>
- 21 15.03.
- 22 (b) An affiant may swear to a complaint before:
- (1) a magistrate, district attorney, or county
- 24 attorney in person or through an electronic broadcast system; or

- 1 (2) another person authorized to take oaths under
- 2 Section 602.002, Government Code, in person.
- 3 SECTION 3. Article 21.22, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
- 4 amended to read as follows:
- 5 Art. 21.22. INFORMATION BASED UPON COMPLAINT. An [No]
- 6 information may not [shall] be presented until affidavit has been
- 7 made by some credible person charging the defendant with an
- 8 offense. The affidavit shall be filed with the information. It may
- 9 be sworn to before the district or county attorney [who, for that
- 10 purpose, shall have power to administer the oath, or [it may be
- 11 made before] any other officer authorized by law to administer
- 12 oaths <u>pursuant to Article 15.052</u>.
- SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 14 an oath sworn to on or after the effective date of this Act.
- SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
