Section 901.304(a), Occupations Code, is amended 8 to read as follows: 9 (a) For each examination or reexamination, the board by rule 10 shall apportion an amount of the total examination fee among the parts of the examination that an applicant is eligible to take on a 11 12 particular examination date. For each examination or reexamination, the board shall collect from each applicant a fee 13 set by board rule not to exceed the cost of administering the parts 14 15 of the examination that the applicant is eligible to take. Sec. 901.311. 3 RESTRUCTURE OF EXAMINATION. On the [<del>][</del>] the uniform CPA examination 4 restructuring of [<del>is</del> restructured], the board by rule shall determine the manner in 5 which credit for a subject is integrated into the new structure. 6

7 SECTION 7. Section 901.355(a), Occupations Code, is amended 8 to read as follows:

9 (a) The holder of a certificate, license, or degree 10 authorizing the person to practice public accountancy in a foreign country who on or before September 1, 2023, registered [may 11 12 register] with the board as the holder of a certificate, license, or degree issued by the foreign country <u>may continue to practice in</u> 13 this state under that registration for as long as the person stays 14 15 in compliance with the provisions of this chapter and board rules applicable to the person[, if the board determines that the 16 17 standards under which the applicant was certified or otherwise authorized to practice public accountancy were at least as high as 18 19 the standards of this state at the time that authority was granted]. 20 SECTION 8.
