## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the recovery of certain direct administrative costs
3	incurred by the Texas State Board of Public Accountancy in imposing
4	disciplinary action against a license holder.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Section 901.501(a), Occupations Code, is amended
7	to read as follows:
8	(a) On a determination that a ground for discipline exists
9	under Section 901.502, after notice and hearing as provided by
10	Section 901.509, the board may:
11	(1) revoke a certificate, firm license, or practice
12	privilege issued under this chapter;
13	(2) suspend under any terms a certificate, firm
14	license, practice privilege, or license issued under this chapter
15	for a period not to exceed five years;
16	(3) refuse to renew a license;
17	(4) place a license holder on probation;
18	(5) reprimand a license holder;
19	(6) limit the scope of a license holder's practice;
20	(7) require a license holder to complete a peer review
21	program conducted in the manner prescribed by the board;
22	(8) require a license holder to complete a continuing

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(9) impose on a license holder the direct

education program specified by the board;

- 1 administrative costs incurred by the board in taking action under
- 2 this subsection, including fees or costs related to:
- 3 (A) <u>attorneys</u>, consultants, and witnesses;
- 4 (B) time spent by board employees to investigate
- 5 or prosecute the disciplinary ground;
- 6 (C) copying and filing documents;
- 7 <u>(D) court reporters;</u>
- 8 <u>(E) hearings conducted by the State Office of</u>
- 9 Administrative Hearings;
- 10 <u>(F)</u> case management;
- (G) preparing for a hearing, trial, or appeal,
- 12 including preparing any exhibits;
- 13 <u>(H) travel and per diem expenses for enforcement</u>
- 14 committee members; and
- 15 <u>(I) any other costs or fees reasonably</u>
- 16 attributable to the investigation or prosecution of the
- 17 disciplinary ground [Subdivisions (1) through (8)];
- 18 (10) require a license holder to pay restitution as
- 19 provided by Section 901.6015;
- 20 (11) impose an administrative penalty under
- 21 Subchapter L; or
- 22 (12) impose any combination of the sanctions provided
- 23 by this subsection.
- SECTION 2. Section 901.501(a), Occupations Code, as amended
- 25 by this Act, applies only to disciplinary action regarding conduct
- 26 that occurs on or after the effective date of this Act. Conduct
- 27 that occurs before the effective date of this Act is governed by the

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- 1 law in effect on the date the conduct occurred, and the former law
- 2 is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 3 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
