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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the creation of the Texas Slavery and Segregation
3	Commission.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle D, Title 4, Government Code, is amended
6	by adding Chapter 452 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 452. TEXAS SLAVERY AND SEGREGATION COMMISSION
8	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS
9	Sec. 452.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
10	(1) "Commission" means the Texas Slavery and
11	Segregation Commission.
12	(2) "Segregation" means the legally or socially
13	enforced separation of facilities, services, and opportunities,
14	such as housing, medical care, education, employment, and
15	transportation, on the basis of race or ethnicity.
16	(3) "Slavery" means the enslavement of approximately
17	six million Africans and thousands of other persons in the United
18	States before the passage of the 13th Amendment to the United States
19	Constitution. It includes state-sponsored, systematic acts of
20	persecution, discrimination, violence, and other human rights
21	violations committed against those persons by former slaveholders
22	and slave traders.
23	Sec. 452.002. SUNSET PROVISION. The Texas Slavery and
24	Segregation Commission is subject to Chapter 325 (Texas Sunset

1	Act). Unless continued in existence as provided by that chapter,
2	the commission is abolished and this chapter expires September 1,
3	2035.
4	Sec. 452.003. ADMINISTRATIVE ATTACHMENT. The commission is
5	administratively attached to the office of the secretary of state.
6	Sec. 452.004. COMPOSITION OF COMMISSION. (a) The
7	commission is composed of the following 18 members:
8	(1) 15 public members appointed as follows:
9	(A) five public members appointed by the
10	governor;
11	(B) five public members appointed by the
12	lieutenant governor; and
13	(C) five public members appointed by the speaker
14	of the house of representatives; and
15	(2) three ex officio members as follows:
16	(A) the commissioner of education;
17	(B) the commissioner of higher education; and
18	(C) the executive director of the Texas Veterans
19	Commission.
20	(b) The speaker of the house of representatives shall
21	designate a member of the house and the lieutenant governor shall
22	designate a member of the senate to advise the commission.
23	Sec. 452.005. PUBLIC MEMBERS: ELIGIBILITY; APPOINTMENT;
24	VACANCY. (a) A person appointed as a public member of the
25	commission under Section 452.004 must be a resident of this state.
26	(b) Public members of the commission must include:
27	(1) persons who have served prominently as leaders of

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1	or spokespersons for public or private organizations that serve
2	members of racial and ethnic groups that were victims of slavery or
3	segregation;
4	(2) persons who have significant professional
5	experience in the field of slavery or segregation education; and
6	(3) persons who have demonstrated a significant,
7	particular interest in slavery or segregation education.
8	(c) Appointments of public members to the commission shall
9	be made:
10	(1) without regard to the race, color, disability,
11	sex, religion, age, or national origin of an appointee; and
12	(2) so that each geographic area of this state is
13	represented on the commission.
14	(d) The original appointing authority shall fill any
15	vacancy in an appointed position by appointing a new public member
16	for the unexpired portion of the term.
17	Sec. 452.006. EX OFFICIO MEMBERS: ELIGIBILITY; DESIGNATION
18	OF REPRESENTATIVE. (a) An ex officio member of the commission
19	vacates the person's position on the commission if the person
20	ceases to hold the position that qualifies the person for service on
21	the commission.
22	(b) An ex officio member may designate a representative to
23	serve on the commission in the member's absence. A representative
24	designated under this subsection must be an officer or employee of
25	the state agency that employs the ex officio member.
26	Sec. 452.007. REMOVAL OF PUBLIC MEMBER. (a) It is a ground
27	for removal of a public member from the commission if the member:

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1	(1) is ineligible for public membership under Section
2	<u>452.005(a);</u>
3	(2) cannot, because of illness or disability,
4	discharge the member's duties for a substantial part of the term for
5	which the member is appointed; or
6	(3) is absent from more than three consecutive
7	regularly scheduled commission meetings that the member is eligible
8	to attend during a calendar year, unless the absence is excused by a
9	majority vote of the commission.
10	(b) The validity of an action taken by the commission is not
11	affected by the fact that it is taken when a ground for removal of a
12	public member exists.
13	(c) If a member of the commission has knowledge that a
14	potential ground for removal exists, the member shall notify the
15	presiding officer of the commission of the potential ground. The
16	presiding officer shall then notify the governor and the attorney
17	general that a potential ground for removal exists.
18	Sec. 452.008. TERM OF PUBLIC MEMBER. (a) A public member
19	of the commission serves a four-year term expiring February 1 of
20	every other odd-numbered year.
21	(b) A public member is eligible for reappointment to another
22	term or part of a term.
23	(c) A public member may not serve more than two consecutive
24	terms. For purposes of this prohibition, a member is considered to
25	have served a term only if the member has served more than half of
26	the term.
27	Sec. 452.009. OFFICERS; SUBCOMMITTEES. (a) The governor

shall designate a public member of the commission as presiding 1 2 officer to serve in that capacity at the pleasure of the governor. (b) The presiding officer of the commission may appoint a 3 subcommittee for any purpose consistent with the duties of the 4 5 commission under this chapter. 6 Sec. 452.010. COMPENSATION; EXPENSES. (a) A public member 7 of the commission is not entitled to compensation but is entitled to 8 reimbursement for travel expenses incurred by the member while transacting commission business, as provided by the General 9 10 Appropriations Act. (b) An ex officio member's service on the commission is an 11 12 additional duty of the underlying position that qualifies the member for service on the commission. The entitlement of an ex 13 14 officio member to compensation or to reimbursement for travel 15 expenses incurred while transacting commission business is governed by the law that applies to the member's service in that 16 17 underlying position, and any payment to the member for either purpose must be made from money that may be used for the purpose and 18 19 is available to the state agency that the member serves in that 20 underlying position. 21 Sec. 452.011. MEETINGS; QUORUM; VOTING; PUBLIC ACCESS. (a) 22 The commission shall meet at least quarterly at the times and places 23 in this state that the commission designates. 24 (b) Seven voting members of the commission constitute a quorum for transacting commission business. An ex officio member 25 26 of the commission may not vote on commission business.

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27 (c) The commission shall develop and implement policies

that provide the public with a reasonable opportunity to appear 1 before the commission and speak on any issue under the jurisdiction 2 3 of the commission. 4 Sec. 452.012. COORDINATOR. The office of the secretary of 5 state shall provide one part-time employee to serve as the coordinator for the commission to transact commission business. 6 7 SUBCHAPTER B. POWERS AND DUTIES; FUNDING Sec. 452.051. ADVISORY STATUS OF COMMISSION. 8 (a) In implementing its powers and duties under this chapter, 9 the 10 commission functions only in an advisory capacity. Membership on 11 the commission does not constitute a public office. 12 (b) Chapter 2110 does not apply to the commission. Sec. 452.052. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES OF COMMISSION. (a) 13 14 The commission shall: 15 (1) provide advice and assistance to public and private primary and secondary schools and institutions of higher 16 17 education in this state regarding the implementation of courses and awareness programs about slavery and segregation; 18 19 (2) meet with appropriate representatives of public and private organizations, including service organizations, to 20 provide information on and to assist in planning, coordinating, or 21 22 modifying courses and awareness programs about slavery and 23 segregation; 24 (3) determine which, if any, existing memorials, exhibits, or other resources on slavery or segregation could be 25 26 included in or used to support courses and awareness programs about 27 slavery and segregation;

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1	(4) compile a list of volunteers who have agreed to
2	share their verifiable knowledge and experiences regarding slavery
3	or segregation;
4	(5) coordinate events in this state on days designated
5	for memorializing slavery and segregation; and
6	(6) solicit volunteers to participate in
7	commemorative events designed to enhance public awareness of the
8	continuing impact of slavery and segregation.
9	(b) In implementing Subsection (a)(3), the commission may
10	contact and cooperate with:
11	(1) existing public or private resource organizations
12	dedicated to slavery or segregation, including museums, centers,
13	and organizations based in this state;
14	(2) state agencies that carry out the educational
15	functions of the state, including the Texas Education Agency and
16	the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board; and
17	(3) members of the United States Congress and of the
18	legislature of this state.
19	(c) The commission shall adopt rules as necessary for its
20	own procedures.
21	(d) The commission may appoint advisory committees to
22	advise the commission.
23	Sec. 452.053. FUNDING. (a) The commission may accept gifts
24	and grants from a public or private source for the commission to use
25	in performing the commission's powers and duties under this
26	chapter.
27	(b) The office of the secretary of state may provide staff

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1 and support commission functions and activities with money 2 available to the office that may be used for that purpose. The 3 legislature may also specifically appropriate money to the office 4 of the secretary of state to provide staff and to otherwise support 5 commission functions and activities. 6 SECTION 2. (a) As soon as practicable after the effective 7 date of this Act, the governor, the lieutenant governor, and the

8 speaker of the house of representatives shall appoint public 9 members to the Texas Slavery and Segregation Commission as provided 10 by Chapter 452, Government Code, as added by this Act.

(b) The terms of the initial public members appointed to the
Texas Slavery and Segregation Commission expire February 1, 2027.
SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
