4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 501.260, Occupations Code, is amended by
6	amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (b-1) to read as
7	follows:
8	(b) The executive council shall set the standards to qualify
9	for a license under this section. The standards must include:
10	(1) satisfaction of minimum recognized graduate
11	degree requirements;
12	(2) completion of graduate course work at a regionally
13	accredited institution of higher education in:
14	<pre>(A) psychological foundations;</pre>
15	(B) educational foundations;
16	(C) interventions;
17	(D) assessments; and
18	(E) professional issues and ethics;
19	(3) completion of at least 1,200 hours of supervised
20	experience;
21	(4) proficiency in the practice of school psychology
22	as demonstrated by:
23	(A) receipt of a passing score on a nationally
24	recognized qualifying examination determined to be appropriate by

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1 the executive council and on any other examination required by the 2 executive council; or

3 (B) active certification as a nationally 4 certified school psychologist by the National Association of School 5 Psychologists or a successor organization; and

6 (5) satisfaction of the requirements under Sections
7 501.2525(a)(3)-(9).

8 (b-1) The executive council may not set a standard to 9 qualify for a license under this section that requires a person who 10 meets the standard set by the executive council corresponding to 11 Subsection (b)(4)(B) to complete any examination, including an 12 examination regarding jurisprudence.

13 SECTION 2. Section 501.260, Occupations Code, as amended by 14 this Act, applies only to an application for a license submitted 15 under that section on or after the effective date of this Act. An 16 application submitted before the effective date of this Act is 17 governed by the law in effect on the date the application was 18 submitted, and the former law is continued in effect for that 19 purpose.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2023.

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
