(c) The department may contract with a third-party personal data verification service to assist the department in verifying a claim of <u>an address of principal residence</u> [domicile], including whether the physical address provided by the applicant is the applicant's actual <u>principal</u> residence.

25 SECTION 5. Sections 521.271(a) and (b), Transportation 26 Code, are amended to read as follows:

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(a) Each original driver's license, provisional license,

(5) unless an earlier date is otherwise provided, a driver's license issued to a person whose <u>address of principal</u> residence [or domicile] is a correctional facility or a parole facility expires on the first birthday of the license holder occurring after the first anniversary of the date of issuance.

(b) Except as provided by Section 521.2711, a driver's
21 license that is renewed expires on the earlier of:

(1) the eighth anniversary of the expiration date
before renewal if the applicant is a citizen, national, or legal
permanent resident of the United States or a refugee or asylee
lawfully admitted into the United States;

26 (1-a) for an applicant not described by Subdivision 27 (1):

the earlier of: 1 (A) 2 (i) the eighth anniversary of the 3 expiration date before renewal; or 4 (ii) the expiration date of the applicant's 5 authorized stay in the United States; or 6 (B) the first anniversary of the date of 7 issuance, if there is no definite expiration date for the 8 applicant's authorized stay in the United States; or 9 (2) for a renewal driver's license issued to a person whose <u>address of principal</u> residence [or domicile] is 10 а correctional facility or a parole facility, the first birthday of 11 the license holder occurring after the first anniversary of the 12 date of issuance unless an earlier date is otherwise provided. 13 SECTION 6. Section 521.421(a-2), Transportation Code, is 14 15 amended to read as follows: 16 (a-2) Except as provided by Subsection (a-1), the 17 department by rule shall establish the fee for a personal identification certificate or driver's license issued to a person 18 whose <u>address of principal</u> residence [or domicile] 19 is а

SECTION 7. The changes in law made by this Act apply to an application for a driver's license or personal identification certificate submitted on or after the effective date of this Act. An application for a driver's license or personal identification certificate submitted before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the application was submitted, and the former law is continued in effect for that
