4	SECTION 1. Section 406.009(d), Government Code, is amended

9	(2) the failure to comply with Section 406.017;
10	(3) a final conviction for a violation of a law
11	concerning the regulation of the conduct of notaries public in this

13	(4) the imposition on the notary public of an
14	administrative, criminal, or civil penalty for a violation of a law
15	or rule prescribing the duties of a notary public; $[er]$
16	(5) performing any notarization when the person for
17	whom the notarization is performed did not personally appear before
18	the notary at the time the notarization is executed; or
19	(6) failure to maintain records under Section 406.014.
20	SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 406, Government Code, is

PERSONALLY APPEARING. (a) A person commits an offense if, as a

notary public, the person knowingly performs any notarization when

- 9 (c) A notary public who has applied for reappointment must
- 10 successfully complete the continuing education requirements
- 11 established under Section 406.023 before being reappointed.
- 12 SECTION 4. Section 406.014, Government Code, is amended by
- 13 adding Subsection (f) to read as follows:
- 14 (f) A notary public shall retain the records required by
- 15 Subsection (a) until the 15th anniversary of the date of
- 16 notarization.
- SECTION 5. Section 406.023, Government Code, is amended by
- 18 adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 19 <u>(d) The secretary of state shall adopt rules necessary to</u>
- 20 establish continuing education requirements for reappointment as a
- 21 notary public.
- SECTION 6. Not later than January 1, 2024, the secretary of
- 23 state shall adopt rules necessary to implement the change in law
- 24 made by this Act.
- 25 SECTION 7. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 26 to an application for a notary public reappointment submitted on or
- 27 after January 1, 2024. An application submitted before January 1,

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- 1 2024, is governed by the law as it existed immediately before the
- 2 effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for
- 3 that purpose.
- 4 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
