BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-19 SECTION 1. Section 72.154(a), Government Code, is amended 1-20 to read as follows:

1-21 (a) Subject to Subsections (c) and (d) and Section 72.158, the office shall establish and maintain the registry in a manner that allows a member of the public, free of charge, to electronically search for and receive publicly accessible 1-22 1-23 1-24 information contained in the registry regarding each protective 1-25 order issued in this state. (2) the name of a person who is the subject of the
