A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to a study on infant mortality and maternal mortality and morbidity in this state. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 In this section, "team" means the state 5 SECTION 1. (a) child fatality review team coordinated by the Health and Human 6 Services Commission. 7 The team shall conduct a study on infant mortality and 8 (b) 9 maternal mortality and morbidity in this state. In conducting the 10 study, the team shall: 11 (1)investigate disparities among race and ethnicity, 12 socioeconomic status, and geographic regions in this state; 13 (2) compare maternal mortality and morbidity rates 14 among Black women in this state in relation to maternal mortality and morbidity rates among: 15 16 (A) each other race and ethnicity; and other women based on socioeconomic status and 17 (B) education level; 18 (3) assess the impact of social determinants 19 of information 20 including evaluation of health, an on pregnancy-related deaths, pregnancy-related complications that 21 22 almost resulted in death, and morbidities, to identify any 23 correlation in that information to women who are uninsured, receive health coverage under Medicaid, and receive health coverage through 24

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1 a private insurer; and

2 (4) assess the extent to which implicit biases held by
3 health care providers against Black individuals affect maternal
4 mortality and morbidity among Black women.

5 (c) Not later than December 1, 2024, the team shall prepare 6 and submit to the governor, lieutenant governor, and legislature a 7 written report that:

8 (1) summarizes the results of the study conducted 9 under this section; and

10 (2) includes the recommendations based on the results 11 of the study for:

12 (A) reducing infant mortality in this state; and

13 (B) addressing disparities in maternal mortality14 and morbidity among Black women.

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SECTION 2. This Act expires December 31, 2024.

16 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 17 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 19 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 20 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.

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
