5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 501, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Sections 501.0515 and 501.071 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 501.0515. PROCEDURES FOR TRANSPORTATION OF FEMALE
8	INMATES FOR MEDICAL CARE. The department shall establish
9	procedures to be used during the regularly scheduled transportation
10	of female inmates for nonemergency medical care to The University
11	of Texas Medical Branch at Galveston or another medical facility
12	that provides medical services for inmates. The procedures must
13	ensure that:
14	(1) any searches conducted are performed in an area
15	and manner that conforms with the requirements of the Prison Rape
16	Elimination Act of 2003 (34 U.S.C. Section 30301 et seq.) and any
17	regulation adopted under that Act;
18	(2) buses used to transport female inmates are
19	equipped with bathrooms and have an adequate supply of toilet paper
20	and feminine hygiene products as defined by Section 501.0675 for
21	the inmates being transported;
22	(3) female inmates receive sufficient food and
23	nutrition in accordance with medical or nutritional standards as
24	determined by the department; and

2 while being transported have an adequate number of beds for the
3 inmates being transported.

4 Sec. 501.071. ACCESS TO TELEMEDICINE AND TELEHEALTH 5 SERVICES AND ON-SITE MEDICAL CARE. The department, in conjunction with The University of Texas Medical Branch at Galveston and the 6 Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center, shall establish 7 procedures to increase opportunities and expand access to 8 telemedicine medical services and telehealth services, as those 9 terms are defined by Section 111.001, Occupations Code, and on-site 10 medical care for inmates, including on-site mobile care units that 11 12 provide diagnostic imaging, physical therapy, and other appropriate mobile health services. 13

14 SECTION 2. Not later than December 1, 2023, the Texas 15 Department of Criminal Justice shall establish the procedures 16 required by Sections 501.0515 and 501.071, Government Code, as 17 added by this Act.

SECTION 3. Not later than December 1, 2024, the Texas 18 Department of Criminal Justice shall submit a report to the 19 department's progress 20 legislature on the in increasing opportunities and expanding access to telemedicine medical 21 22 services and telehealth services and on-site medical care for inmates under Section 501.071, Government Code, as added by this 23 24 Act, including a summary of the procedures established under that section and the number of inmates who received services or care 25 26 under those procedures.
