APPLICATION OF SUNSET ACT. 9 The Texas Commission of Licensing and Regulation and the Texas Department of 10 11 Licensing and Regulation are subject to Chapter 325, Government 12 Code (Texas Sunset Act). Unless continued in existence as provided by that chapter, the commission and the department are abolished 13 14 September 1, 2033. SECTION 2. Section 51.202(a), Occupations Code, is amended 15 to read as follows: 16 17 The commission shall set fees, in amounts reasonable and (a) necessary to cover the costs of administering the programs or 18 activities, for: 19 licenses issued by the department; 20 (1)21 (2) license renewals and late renewals; 22 (3) examinations; and any other program or activity administered by the 23 (4) department [for which a fee is authorized]. 24

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SECTION 3. Section 51.207(c), Occupations Code, is amended
to read as follows:

3 (c) The commission by rule may require an applicant, license holder, or other person who regularly receives correspondence from 4 the department to provide an [may satisfy any requirement under 5 this chapter or another law governing a program subject to 6 regulation by the department to provide notice by delivering the 7 8 notice by] e-mail address to the department for purposes of receiving correspondence [to the recipient's last known e-mail 9 10 address if the recipient has previously authorized the department to deliver the notice by e-mail]. An e-mail address used under this 11 12 subsection is confidential and is not subject to disclosure under Chapter 552, Government Code. 13

SECTION 4. Section 51.209, Occupations Code, is amended by adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:

16 (d) Notwithstanding any other law, Chapter 2110, Government
17 Code, does not apply to an advisory board established to advise the
18 commission or department.

SECTION 5. Subchapter H, Chapter 51, Occupations Code, is
 amended by adding Section 51.4014 to read as follows:

21 <u>Sec. 51.4014. LICENSE APPLICATION FROM INMATE. (a)</u> 22 <u>Notwithstanding any other law, the department may accept an</u> 23 <u>application from an applicant who is an inmate imprisoned in the</u> 24 <u>Texas Department of Criminal Justice except that the department may</u> 25 <u>not issue the license until the applicant has been released.</u>

26 (b) This section does not limit the ability of the 27 department to determine or verify the applicant's eligibility for
