- SECTION 2. Section 51.202(a), Occupations Code, is amended 15

- The commission shall set fees, in amounts reasonable and 17

- 21 (2) license renewals and late renewals;

- SECTION 3. Section 51.207(c), Occupations Code, is amended

- 22 Notwithstanding any other law, the department may accept an
- 23 application from an applicant who is an inmate imprisoned in the
- 24 Texas Department of Criminal Justice except that the department may
- 25 not issue the license until the applicant has been released.
- 26 (b) This section does not limit the ability of the
- 27 department to determine or verify the applicant's eligibility for

- 3 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
