- 1 section, "luggage" means a suitcase, duffel bag, backpack, or
- 2 similar container designed to hold an individual's personal
- 3 belongings.
- 4 (b) The department shall:
- 5 (1) establish and maintain a decentralized supply of
- 6 <u>luggage to be used to transport a foster child's personal</u>
- 7 belongings; and
- 8 (2) develop procedures for the storage and
- 9 distribution of luggage.
- 10 (c) The department shall provide luggage to a child who is
- 11 being removed from the child's home or changing placement. Luggage
- 12 provided to a child under this subsection belongs to the child and
- 13 may not be reclaimed by the department or retained by the child's
- 14 foster parent. The department is not required to provide new
- 15 <u>luggage under this subsection to a child who is changing placement</u>
- 16 and has the luggage previously provided by the department.
- 17 (d) The department shall maintain a record of each time a
- 18 trash bag is used to move a foster child's personal belongings. The
- 19 record must include the reason the department did not provide the
- 20 child with appropriate luggage to move the child's personal
- 21 belongings.
- (e) The department shall submit an annual report to the
- 23 legislature that includes a summary of:
- 24 (1) the number of times a trash bag was used to
- 25 transport a foster child's personal belongings and the reasons the
- 26 department failed to provide the child with appropriate luggage;

- 1 (2) the department's supply inventory and inventory
- 2 management practices for the luggage supply maintained under
- 3 Subsection (b).
- 4 (e-1) This subsection and Subsection (e) expire September
- 5 <u>1, 2025.</u>
- 6 (f) The department may solicit and accept gifts, grants, and
- 7 donations of any kind and from any source for purposes of this
- 8 <u>section.</u>
- 9 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
