5	SECTION 1. Chapter 51, Occupations Code, is amended by
6	adding Subchapter K, and a heading is added to that subchapter to

8	SUBCHAPTER K. COMBATING HUMAN TRAFFICKING
9	SECTION 2. Subchapter K, Chapter 51, Occupations Code, is
10	amended by adding Sections 51.551, 51.552, and 51.553 to read as
11	follows:
12	Sec. 51.551. ANTI-TRAFFICKING ACTIVITIES. The department
13	is authorized to combat human trafficking by:
14	(1) establishing within the department ar
15	<pre>anti-trafficking unit;</pre>
16	(2) identifying businesses operating within
17	industries regulated by the department that are impacted by human
18	trafficking; and

- 3 Sec. 51.552. RULES. The commission may adopt rules to
- 4 combat human trafficking for any program regulated by the
- 5 department, including rules for conducting inspections and
- 6 investigations under Section 51.351.
- 7 <u>Sec. 51.553. CONFIDENTIALITY OF RECORDS IDENTIFYING</u>
- 8 VICTIMS OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING. (a) Information that identifies an
- 9 individual as a victim of human trafficking is confidential and
- 10 excepted from disclosure under Section 552.021, Government Code.
- 11 (b) The department may withhold information under
- 12 Subsection (a) without the necessity of requesting a decision from
- 13 the attorney general under Subchapter G, Chapter 552, Government
- 14 Code.
- 15 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 19 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
