A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

4 SECTION 1. Article 56A.051, Code of Criminal Procedure, is

5 amended by adding Subsections (d), (e), (f), and (g) to read as

6 follows:

- 7 (d) A victim, guardian of a victim, or close relative of a
- 8 deceased victim may assert and seek enforcement of any right
- 9 granted by this subchapter, either orally or in writing.
- 10 <u>(e) The attorney representing the state or an attorney</u>
- 11 representing a victim, guardian of a victim, or close relative of a
- 12 deceased victim may assert a right granted by this subchapter to the
- 13 victim, guardian, or relative, or request enforcement of the right,
- 14 by filing a motion, petition for a writ of mandamus, or action for
- 15 injunctive or declaratory relief in a trial or appellate court with
- 16 jurisdiction over the case.
- 17 <u>(f) If the court determines, after a hearing at which all</u>
- 18 parties have an opportunity to testify, that a right of a victim,
- 19 guardian of a victim, or close relative of a deceased victim has
- 20 been violated, the court shall order that the victim, guardian, or
- 21 relative be provided the right to which the victim, guardian, or
- 22 relative was entitled.
- 23 (g) A remedy ordered under Subsection (f) may not change
