## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to school district policies on dating violence, sexual
3	assault, stalking, sexual abuse, and sexual harassment; providing
4	an administrative penalty.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Section 37.0812, Education Code, is amended by
7	adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:
8	(c) A school district peace officer or school resource
9	officer shall complete the school district's comprehensive
10	training program on dating violence, sexual assault, stalking,
11	sexual abuse, and sexual harassment as required by Section 37.0831.
12	SECTION 2. Section 37.0831, Education Code, is amended to
13	read as follows:
14	Sec. 37.0831. DATING VIOLENCE, SEXUAL ASSAULT, STALKING,
15	SEXUAL ABUSE, AND SEXUAL HARASSMENT POLICIES; EDUCATIONAL
16	MATERIALS AND RESOURCES. (a) Each school district shall adopt and
17	implement a [dating violence] policy on dating violence, sexual
18	assault, stalking, sexual abuse, and sexual harassment to be
19	included in the district improvement plan under Section 11.252.

- 20 (b) The [A dating violence] policy must:
- 21 (1) include:
- 22 (A) <u>definitions of "dating violence," "sexual</u> 23 <u>assault," and "stalking" that have the meanings assigned by the</u>
- 24 Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime

- Statistics Act (20 U.S.C. Section 1092(f)(6)(A)) [a definition of dating violence that includes the intentional use of physical, 2 3 sexual, verbal, or emotional abuse by a person to harm, threaten, intimidate, or control another person in a dating relationship, as 4
- 5 defined by Section 71.0021, Family Code];

- 6 (B) a definition of "sexual harassment" that
- 7 means unwelcome, sex-based verbal or physical conduct that:
- 8 (i) in the employment context, unreasonably
- interferes with a person's work performance or creates an 9
- intimidating, hostile, or offensive work environment; or 10
- 11 (ii) in the education context, is
- 12 sufficiently severe, persistent, or pervasive that the conduct
- interferes with a student's ability to participate in or benefit 13
- from education programs or activities at a secondary school; 14
- 15 (C) a clear statement that dating violence,
- sexual assault, stalking, sexual abuse, and sexual harassment are 16
- 17 [is] not tolerated at school; [and]
- (D) [<del>(C) reporting</del>] procedures, protocols, and 18
- 19 guidelines for reporting and responding to incidents [students who
- are victims] of dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, sexual 20
- abuse, and sexual harassment, including a procedure for immediately 21
- notifying the parent or guardian of a student about a report 22
- received by the district identifying the student as an alleged 23
- 24 victim or perpetrator of dating violence, sexual assault, stalking,
- sexual abuse, or sexual harassment; [and] 25
- 26 (E) a comprehensive training program in
- accordance with Subsection (d) or (e); and 27

- 1 (F) interim measures to protect victims of dating
- 2 violence, sexual assault, stalking, sexual abuse, and sexual
- 3 harassment during the pendency of the school's disciplinary
- 4 process, including protection from retaliation, and any other
- 5 accommodations available to those victims at the school; and
- 6 (2) address safety planning, enforcement of
- 7 protective orders, [school-based alternatives to protective
- 8 orders, training for teachers and administrators at each district
- 9 campus that instructs students in grade six or higher, counseling
- 10 for affected students, and awareness education for students and
- 11 parents.
- 12 (c) To the extent possible, a school district shall make
- 13 available to students:
- 14 (1) age-appropriate educational materials that
- 15 include information on the dangers of dating violence, sexual
- 16 <u>assault, stalking, sexual abuse, and sexual harassment;</u> and
- 17 (2) resources to students seeking help.
- 18 <u>(d) The comprehensive training program:</u>
- 19 (1) must be provided annually to school counselors,
- 20 teachers, nurses, administrators, and other staff, as well as law
- 21 enforcement officers and social workers who regularly interact with
- 22 students;
- 23 (2) must be completed not later than the 30th
- 24 instructional day following the first day of school and may be
- 25 offered online;
- 26 (3) must be included in the employee school district
- 27 handbook;

(4) may include participation by community 1 2 organizations with relevant existing research-based programs aimed 3 at providing training for school staff; 4 (5) must include information on: 5 (A) the meanings of and methods for preventing and identifying incidents of dating violence, sexual assault, 6 7 stalking, sexual abuse, and sexual harassment; (B) the school district's policy on dating 8 violence, sexual assault, stalking, sexual abuse, and sexual 9 10 harassment; (C) procedures, protocols, and guidelines for 11 12 responding to and reporting incidents of dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, sexual abuse, and sexual harassment; and 13 (D) the name, location, and contact information 14 15 of the district's Title IX coordinator; and 16 (6) may include information relating to the district's 17 trauma-informed care policy under Section 38.036. (e) If a school district does not have sufficient resources 18 to provide the comprehensive training program required under 19 Subsection (d), the district shall work in conjunction with a 20 community organization to provide the training at no cost to the 21 22 district. (f) Not later than the 30th instructional day following the 23 24 first day of school, each school district shall make the school's policy on dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, sexual abuse, 25 26 and sexual harassment available to parents and students by:

(1) including the policy in the annual student

- 1 <u>handbook</u>;
- 2 (2) posting the policy on the school's Internet
- 3 website that is accessible from the home page of the Internet
- 4 website by use of not more than three links; and
- 5 (3) providing a written copy of the policy to the
- 6 parent of or other person standing in parental relation to each
- 7 student enrolled in the school.
- 8 (g) Each school district shall ensure that any
- 9 informational materials distributed to students are
- 10 age-appropriate.
- 11 (h) Not later than the 30th day following the last
- 12 instructional day of the school year, the Title IX coordinator of
- 13 each school district shall prepare and submit an annual written
- 14 report to the agency regarding incidents of dating violence, sexual
- 15 assault, stalking, sexual abuse, and sexual harassment at the
- 16 district. The report must include:
- 17 (1) a certification by the superintendent that each
- 18 school within the district is in substantial compliance with the
- 19 training and reporting requirements under this section;
- 20 (2) the total number of reported incidents of dating
- 21 violence, sexual assault, stalking, sexual abuse, and sexual
- 22 harassment;
- 23 (3) a summary of each investigation of a reported
- 24 incident; and
- 25 (4) a summary of the disposition of each reported
- 26 incident:
- 27 (A) that resulted in disciplinary measures by the

- 1 <u>district; or</u>
- 2 (B) for which the district determined that
- 3 <u>disciplinary measures were not necessary.</u>
- 4 (i) If the agency determines that a school district is not
- 5 in compliance with the training or reporting requirements, the
- 6 commissioner may take any appropriate action authorized to be taken
- 7 by the commissioner under Chapter 39A.
- 8 (j) The agency shall prepare and submit an annual written
- 9 report to the governor, lieutenant governor, speaker of the house
- 10 of representatives, and standing committees with primary
- 11 jurisdiction over education that includes:
- 12 (1) the number of incidents of dating violence, sexual
- 13 assault, stalking, sexual abuse, and sexual harassment in each
- 14 school district;
- 15 (2) a list of school districts that are in compliance
- 16 or out of compliance with the training and reporting requirements
- 17 under this section; and
- 18 <u>(3)</u> penalties imposed on any district.
- 19 SECTION 3. Each school district shall implement a policy on
- 20 dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, sexual abuse, and sexual
- 21 harassment as required by Section 37.0831, Education Code, as
- 22 amended by this Act, not later than the beginning of the 2023-2024
- 23 school year.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 25 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 26 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 27 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
