H.B. No. 3809

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the study of public education performance. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Subtitle B, Title 2, Education Code, is amended by adding Chapter 9 to read as follows: 5 6 CHAPTER 9. CENTER FOR PUBLIC EDUCATION PERFORMANCE INFORMATION Sec. 9.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter: 7 (1) "Board" means the Center for Public Education 8 9 Performance Information Board. (2) "Center" means the Center for Public Education 10 11 Performance Information. 12 Sec. 9.002. CENTER FOR PUBLIC EDUCATION PERFORMANCE INFORMATION. (a) The Center for Public Education Performance 13 14 Information is created as an independent policy center. (b) The center shall represent business, finance, public 15 16 policy, education, and other interests considered appropriate by 17 the center. 18 (c) In performing the duties provided by this chapter, the cente<u>r shall:</u> 19 (1) work directly with the governor, lieutenant 20 21 governor, speaker of the house of representatives, and members of the legislature; and 22 23 (2) work with the agency and other state agencies, 24 regional education service centers, school districts, and

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1	open-enrollment charter schools.
2	Sec. 9.003. CENTER DUTIES. (a) The center shall promote
3	the use of successful methods to increase performance at the school
4	district and campus levels.
5	(b) The center shall evaluate and rank the performance of
6	each school district, campus, and open-enrollment charter school
7	and provide a progress report and recommendations each year to:
8	(1) the governor, lieutenant governor, speaker of the
9	house of representatives, Legislative Budget Board, commissioner,
10	and State Board of Education; and
11	(2) districts, campuses, and open-enrollment charter
12	schools.
13	(c) The center may assist the legislature with policy
14	studies related to the center's duties. The center may participate
15	in collaborative studies with a foundation or organization inside
16	or outside this state related to the center's duties.
17	(d) The center shall seek information, data, and best
18	practices from state, regional, and national sources to use in
19	performing the center's duties provided by this chapter.
20	(e) The center may contract with independent experts,
21	academic scholars, and other appropriate professionals in
22	performing the center's duties provided by this chapter.
23	Sec. 9.004. BOARD. (a) The Center for Public Education
24	Performance Information Board is created as the primary
25	policy-making body of the center.
26	(b) The board is composed of seven members. Members of the
27	board shall be appointed as follows:

1	(1) one member appointed by the governor;
2	(2) one additional member appointed by the governor
3	from a list of nominees submitted by the speaker of the house of
4	representatives;
5	(3) one member appointed by the lieutenant governor;
6	(4) one member appointed by the commissioner;
7	(5) one member appointed by the commissioner of higher
8	education;
9	(6) one member appointed by the chair of the State
10	Board of Education; and
11	(7) one member appointed by the chair of the Texas
12	Workforce Commission.
13	(c) In making an appointment under Subsection (b)(2), the
14	governor may reject one or more nominees on a list submitted by the
15	speaker of the house of representatives and request a new list of
16	different nominees.
17	(d) The board members appointed under this section must
18	include individuals in the private sector who have an interest in
19	improving performance in public education and significant
20	experience in organizational management, finance, or business. A
21	board member may not:
22	(1) be a member of the board of trustees or an employee
23	of a school district or a member of the governing body or an
24	employee of or a charter holder of a charter for an open-enrollment
25	charter school; or
26	(2) have a financial relationship with a vendor or
27	contractor who provides goods or services to any part of the public

1	education system of this state.
2	(e) Board members serve two-year terms.
3	(f) Board members shall annually elect one member as the
4	presiding officer.
5	(g) A board member may not receive a salary for services as a
6	board member but shall be reimbursed for expenses incurred in
7	attending board meetings.
8	Sec. 9.005. BOARD DUTIES. (a) The board shall study the
9	elements of an effective and efficient system of public free
10	schools and make recommendations to:
11	(1) improve the performance of the public education
12	system to meet the demands of the current century;
13	(2) improve the state's ability to compete
14	educationally and economically with other states and countries; and
15	(3) provide the public with information on public
16	education performance.
17	(b) The board shall provide a report of the board's study
18	and recommendations under Subsection (a) to:
19	(1) the Legislative Budget Board at least once each
20	year; and
21	(2) the governor, lieutenant governor, speaker of the
22	house of representatives, legislature, commissioner, and State
23	Board of Education before the convening of each regular legislative
24	session.
25	Sec. 9.006. SUPPORT FOR PERFORMANCE OF DUTIES. (a) State
26	agencies, regional education service centers, school districts,
27	and open-enrollment charter schools shall fully cooperate with and

1 assist the center at the board's request.

(b) Data and information necessary to perform the center's
<u>duties under this chapter shall be provided at the board's request</u>
<u>in a timely manner and at minimal cost. The board and center shall</u>
<u>require confidentiality and other security measures for student</u>
<u>data and information consistent with the Family Educational Rights</u>
<u>and Privacy Act of 1974 (20 U.S.C. Section 1232g).</u>

8 Sec. 9.007. FUNDING. The center may be funded by donations,
9 grants, and legislative appropriations.

10 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
