4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 258.001, Occupations Code, is amended to

- 7 Sec. 258.001. IMPERMISSIBLE DELEGATIONS. A dentist may not
- 8 delegate:

read as follows:

- 9 (1) an act to an individual who, by board order, is 10 prohibited from performing the act;
- 11 (2) any of the following acts to a person not licensed
- 12 as a dentist or dental hygienist:
- 13 (A) the removal of calculus, deposits, or
- 14 accretions from the natural and restored surfaces of exposed human
- 15 teeth and restorations in the human mouth;
- 16 (B) root planing or the smoothing and polishing
- 17 of roughened root surfaces or exposed human teeth; or
- 18 (C) any other act the delegation of which is
- 19 prohibited by board rule;
- 20 (3) any of the following acts to a person not licensed
- 21 as a dentist:
- (A) comprehensive examination or diagnosis and
- 23 treatment planning;
- 24 (B) a surgical or cutting procedure on hard or

- 1 soft tissue;
- 2 (C) the prescription of a drug, medication, or
- 3 work authorization;
- 4 (D) the taking of an impression for a final
- 5 restoration, appliance, or prosthesis;
- 6 (E) the making of an intraoral occlusal
- 7 adjustment;
- 8 (F) direct pulp capping, pulpotomy, or any other
- 9 endodontic procedure;
- 10 (G) the final placement and intraoral adjustment
- 11 of a fixed or removable appliance; or
- 12 (H) the placement of any final restoration; [or]
- 13 (4) the authority to an individual to administer a
- 14 local anesthetic agent, inhalation sedative agent, parenteral
- 15 sedative agent, or general anesthetic agent, including as a
- 16 teledentistry dental service as that term is defined by Section
- 17 111.001, if the individual is not licensed as:
- 18 (A) a dentist with a permit issued by the board
- 19 for the procedure being performed, if a permit is required;
- 20 (B) a certified registered nurse anesthetist
- 21 licensed by the Texas Board of Nursing, only if the delegating
- 22 dentist holds a permit issued by the board for the procedure being
- 23 performed, if a permit is required; or
- (C) a physician anesthesiologist licensed by the
- 25 Texas Medical Board; or
- 26 (5) the authority to a dental hygienist to administer
- 27 a local anesthetic agent unless:

1	(A) the dental hygienist:
2	(i) administers the local anesthetic agent
3	by infiltration for purposes of a procedure the dental hygienist is
4	authorized to perform;
5	(ii) has passed a board-approved
6	certification examination relating to the administration of a local
7	<pre>anesthetic agent;</pre>
8	<u>(iii) either:</u>
9	(a) has completed a board-approved
10	course of study designed to train dental hygienists to administer a
11	local anesthetic agent by infiltration; or
12	(b) during the preceding year, was
13	authorized to administer a local anesthetic agent by:
14	(1) a branch of the United States
15	armed forces; or
16	(2) another state with clinical
17	and didactic education requirements substantially equivalent to
18	the requirements of a course approved by the board under
19	Sub-subparagraph (a); and
20	(iv) complies with any applicable rules
21	adopted by the board establishing minimum standards for the
22	administration of a local anesthetic agent;
23	(B) the delegating dentist is physically present
24	in the facility where the procedure is occurring and is
25	continuously aware of the patient's physical status and well-being;
26	and
27	(C) the patient to whom the local anesthetic

- 2 <u>(i) at least 18 years of age; and</u>
- 3 (ii) not sedated, or is sedated using only
- 4 nitrous oxide-oxygen inhalation.
- 5 SECTION 2. Section 262.002(a), Occupations Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (a) A person practices dental hygiene if the person:
- 8 (1) removes accumulated matter, tartar, deposits,
- 9 accretions, or stains, other than mottled enamel stains, from the
- 10 natural and restored surface of exposed human teeth and
- 11 restorations in the human mouth;
- 12 (2) smoothes roughened root surfaces;
- 13 (3) polishes exposed human teeth, restorations in the
- 14 human mouth, or roughened root surfaces;
- 15 (4) topically applies drugs to the surface tissues of
- 16 the human mouth or the exposed surface of human teeth;
- 17 (5) makes dental x-rays; [and]
- 18 (6) administers a local anesthetic agent under the
- 19 authorization and supervision of a dentist in compliance with
- 20 Section 258.001(5); and
- 21 <u>(7)</u> performs any other service, task, or procedure
- 22 prescribed by board rule.
- SECTION 3. (a) Not later than January 1, 2024, the State
- 24 Board of Dental Examiners shall:
- 25 (1) prescribe by rule the requirements for a course to
- 26 train dental hygienists to administer a local anesthetic agent
- 27 consistent with Section 258.001, Occupations Code, as amended by

- 1 this Act;
- 2 (2) develop a procedure for the approval of courses
- 3 described by Subdivision (1) of this subsection; and
- 4 (3) adopt rules to administer Sections 258.001 and
- 5 262.002, Occupations Code, as amended by this Act, including rules
- 6 to establish the minimum standards for the administration of a
- 7 local anesthetic agent by a dental hygienist consistent with those
- 8 sections.
- 9 (b) A rule adopted under Subsection (a)(1) of this section
- 10 must require that a course be offered in a classroom setting at an
- 11 educational institution accredited by the Commission on Dental
- 12 Accreditation of the American Dental Association.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
