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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the administration of a local anesthetic agent by a 3 dental hygienist. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Section 258.001, Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 Sec. 258.001. IMPERMISSIBLE DELEGATIONS. A dentist may not 7 delegate: 8 an act to an individual who, by board order, is 9 (1) prohibited from performing the act; 10 11 (2) any of the following acts to a person not licensed 12 as a dentist or dental hygienist: 13 (A) the removal of calculus, deposits, or 14 accretions from the natural and restored surfaces of exposed human teeth and restorations in the human mouth; 15 root planing or the smoothing and polishing 16 (B) of roughened root surfaces or exposed human teeth; or 17 18 (C) any other act the delegation of which is prohibited by board rule; 19 any of the following acts to a person not licensed 20 (3) 21 as a dentist: 22 (A) comprehensive examination or diagnosis and 23 treatment planning; a surgical or cutting procedure on hard or 24 (B)

No. 3824 1 soft tissue; (C) the prescription of a drug, medication, or 2 3 work authorization; 4 the taking of an impression for a final (D) 5 restoration, appliance, or prosthesis; 6 (E) the intraoral making of an occlusal 7 adjustment; 8 (F) direct pulp capping, pulpotomy, or any other endodontic procedure; 9 10 (G) the final placement and intraoral adjustment of a fixed or removable appliance; or 11 the placement of any final restoration; [or] 12 (H) (4) the authority to an individual to administer a 13 14 local anesthetic agent, inhalation sedative agent, parenteral 15 sedative agent, or general anesthetic agent, including as a teledentistry dental service as that term is defined by Section 16 17 111.001, if the individual is not licensed as: a dentist with a permit issued by the board 18 (A) for the procedure being performed, if a permit is required; 19 20 (B) a certified registered nurse anesthetist 21 licensed by the Texas Board of Nursing, only if the delegating dentist holds a permit issued by the board for the procedure being 22 23 performed, if a permit is required; or 24 (C) a physician anesthesiologist licensed by the 25 Texas Medical Board; or 26 (5) the authority to a dental hygienist to administer 27 a local anesthetic agent unless:

1 (A) the dental hygienist: 2 (i) administers the local anesthetic agent 3 by infiltration for purposes of a procedure the dental hygienist is 4 authorized to perform; 5 (ii) has passed a board-approved certification examination relating to the administration of a local 6 7 anesthetic agent; 8 (iii) either: 9 (a) has completed a board-approved 10 course of study designed to train dental hygienists to administer a local an<u>esthetic agent by infiltration that consists of at least 40</u> 11 12 hours of didactic education and 30 hours of clinical education; or (b) during the preceding year, was 13 14 authorized to administer a local anesthetic agent by: 15 (1) a branch of the United States 16 armed forces; or 17 (2) another state with clinical and didactic education requirements substantially equivalent to 18 19 the requirements of a course approved by the board under 20 Sub-subparagraph (a); and 21 (iv) complies with any applicable rules 22 adopted by the board establishing minimum standards for the 23 administration of a local anesthetic agent; 24 (B) the delegating dentist is physically present in the facility where the procedure is occurring and is 25 26 continuously aware of the patient's physical status and well-being; 27 and

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1	(C) the patient to whom the local anesthetic
2	agent is administered is:
3	(i) at least 18 years of age; and
4	(ii) not sedated, or is sedated using only
5	nitrous oxide-oxygen inhalation.
6	SECTION 2. Section 262.002(a), Occupations Code, is amended
7	to read as follows:
8	(a) A person practices dental hygiene if the person:
9	(1) removes accumulated matter, tartar, deposits,
10	accretions, or stains, other than mottled enamel stains, from the
11	natural and restored surface of exposed human teeth and
12	restorations in the human mouth;
13	(2) smoothes roughened root surfaces;
14	(3) polishes exposed human teeth, restorations in the
15	human mouth, or roughened root surfaces;
16	(4) topically applies drugs to the surface tissues of
17	the human mouth or the exposed surface of human teeth;
18	(5) makes dental x-rays; [and]
19	(6) administers a local anesthetic agent under the
20	authorization and supervision of a dentist in compliance with
21	Section 258.001(5); and
22	(7) performs any other service, task, or procedure
23	prescribed by board rule.
24	SECTION 3. (a) Not later than January 1, 2024, the State
25	Board of Dental Examiners shall:
26	(1) prescribe by rule the requirements for a course to
27	train dental hygienists to administer a local anesthetic agent

1 consistent with Section 258.001, Occupations Code, as amended by
2 this Act;

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3 (2) develop a procedure for the approval of courses4 described by Subdivision (1) of this subsection; and

5 (3) adopt rules to administer Sections 258.001 and 6 262.002, Occupations Code, as amended by this Act, including rules 7 to establish the minimum standards for the administration of a 8 local anesthetic agent by a dental hygienist consistent with those 9 sections.

10 (b) A rule adopted under Subsection (a)(1) of this section 11 must require that a course be offered in a classroom setting at an 12 educational institution accredited by the Commission on Dental 13 Accreditation of the American Dental Association.

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SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
