A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the duties of a public school counselor.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Sections 33.006(a) and (b), Education Code, are
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 (a) The primary responsibility of a school counselor is to
- 7 counsel students to fully develop each student's academic, career,
- 8 personal, [and] social, and emotional abilities.
- 9 (b) In addition to a school counselor's responsibility
- 10 under Subsection (a), the school counselor shall:
- 11 (1) participate in planning, implementing, and
- 12 evaluating a comprehensive developmental school counseling
- 13 [guidance] program to serve all students and to address the special
- 14 needs of students:
- 15 (A) who are at risk of dropping out of school,
- 16 becoming substance abusers, participating in gang activity, or
- 17 committing suicide;
- 18 (B) who are at risk of:
- 19 (i) choosing an unhealthy or inappropriate
- 20 <u>solution to a problem; or</u>
- (ii) engaging in harmful behavior toward
- 22 the student's self or others;
- (C) who are in need of modified instructional
- 24 strategies; or

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- 1 $\underline{\text{(D)}}$ [$\frac{\text{(C)}}{\text{(C)}}$] who are gifted and talented, with
- 2 emphasis on identifying and serving gifted and talented students
- 3 who are educationally disadvantaged;
- 4 (2) consult with a student's parent or guardian and
- 5 make referrals as appropriate in consultation with the student's
- 6 parent or guardian;
- 7 (3) consult with school staff, parents, and other
- 8 community members to help them increase the effectiveness of
- 9 student education and promote student success;
- 10 (4) coordinate people and resources in the school,
- 11 home, and community;
- 12 (5) with the assistance of school staff, interpret
- 13 standardized test results and other assessment data that help a
- 14 student make educational and career plans;
- 15 (6) deliver classroom guidance activities or serve as
- 16 a consultant to teachers conducting lessons based on the school's
- 17 guidance curriculum; and
- 18 (7) serve as an impartial, nonreporting resource for
- 19 interpersonal conflicts and discord involving two or more students,
- 20 including accusations of bullying under Section 37.0832.
- 21 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2023-2024
- 22 school year.
- 23 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
