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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the duties of a public school counselor. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 33.006(a) and (b), Education Code, are 4 5 amended to read as follows: The primary responsibility of a school counselor is to 6 (a) 7 counsel students to fully develop each student's academic, career, personal, [and] social, and emotional abilities. 8 9 (b) In addition to a school counselor's responsibility under Subsection (a), the school counselor shall: 10 11 (1) participate in planning, implementing, and 12 evaluating a comprehensive developmental school counseling [guidance] program to serve all students and to address the special 13 14 needs of students: who are at risk of dropping out of school, (A) 15 16 becoming substance abusers, participating in gang activity, or committing suicide; 17 18 who are at risk of engaging in harmful or (B) otherwise inappropriate behaviors in response to personal or 19 academic problems; 20 21 (C) who are in need of modified instructional 22 strategies; or 23 (D) [(C)] who are gifted and talented, with 24 emphasis on identifying and serving gifted and talented students

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1 who are educationally disadvantaged;

2 (2) consult with a student's parent or guardian and
3 make referrals as appropriate in consultation with the student's
4 parent or guardian;

5 (3) consult with school staff, parents, and other 6 community members to help them increase the effectiveness of 7 student education and promote student success;

8 (4) coordinate people and resources in the school,9 home, and community;

10 (5) with the assistance of school staff, interpret 11 standardized test results and other assessment data that help a 12 student make educational and career plans;

13 (6) deliver classroom guidance activities or serve as 14 a consultant to teachers conducting lessons based on the school's 15 guidance curriculum; and

16 (7) serve as an impartial, nonreporting resource for 17 interpersonal conflicts and discord involving two or more students, 18 including accusations of bullying under Section 37.0832.

SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2023-2024 school year.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2023.

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
