A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to creating the criminal offense of possession of an animal by a person convicted of multiple offenses involving animal 3 cruelty and to conditions of punishment and community supervision 4 5 for defendants convicted of certain criminal offenses involving animals. 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 7 SECTION 1. Chapter 42, Penal Code, is amended by adding 8 Section 42.107 to read as follows: 9 Sec. 42.107. POSSESSION OF ANIMAL BY PERSON CONVICTED OF 10 MULTIPLE OFFENSES INVOLVING ANIMAL CRUELTY. (a) A person commits 11 an offense if the person: 12 (1) possesses or exercises control over an animal or 13 14 resides in a household in which an animal is present; and (2) has been previously convicted two or more times of 15 16 an offense under: (A) Section 42.091, 42.092, 42.10, or 42.105; or 17 18 (B) federal law or a penal law of another state containing elements that are substantially similar to the elements 19 of an offense described by Paragraph (A). 20 21 (b) An offense under this section is a Class C misdemeanor, except that the offense is a Class B misdemeanor if the defendant 22 23 has previously been convicted of an offense under this section. 24 SECTION 2. Chapter 42, Code of Criminal Procedure, is

1 amended by adding Article 42.26 to read as follows:

Art. 42.26. PERMANENT RELINQUISHMENT OF ANIMALS FOR REPEATED ANIMAL CRUELTY OFFENSES. For a defendant convicted of an offense under Section 42.107, Penal Code, the court shall, as a condition of punishment, require the defendant to permanently relinquish custody of any animals in the defendant's possession.

SECTION 3. Article 42A.511(c), Code of Criminal Procedure,
8 is amended to read as follows:

9 (c) If a judge grants community supervision to a defendant 10 convicted of an offense under Section 21.09, 42.091, 42.092, 42.10, 11 or 42.105, Penal Code, the judge [may]:

(1) <u>shall</u> require the defendant to relinquish custody
of any animals in the defendant's possession;

14 (2) <u>shall</u> prohibit the defendant from possessing or 15 exercising control over any animals or residing in a household 16 where animals are present; <u>and</u> [or]

17 (3) <u>may</u> require the defendant to participate in a 18 psychological counseling or other appropriate treatment program 19 for a period to be determined by the court.

SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to 20 an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. An 21 offense committed before the effective date of this Act is governed 22 23 by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed, and the 24 former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the effective date of 25 26 this Act if any element of the offense occurred before that date. 27 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
