4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle E, Title 2, Health and Safety Code, is
6	amended by adding Chapter 114 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 114. TEXAS WOMEN'S HEALTH CARE CONSORTIUM
8	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS
9	Sec. 114.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
10	(1) "Consortium" means the Texas Women's Health Care
11	Consortium.
12	(2) "Executive committee" means the executive
13	committee of the consortium.
14	(3) "Participating health-related institution of
15	higher education" means an institution listed in Section
16	<u>114.052(1).</u>
17	SUBCHAPTER B. CONSORTIUM
18	Sec. 114.051. ESTABLISHMENT; PURPOSE. The Texas Women's
19	Health Care Consortium is established to:
20	(1) provide preventative health care services for
21	women, including cancer screenings, reproductive health care, and
22	immunizations, through telehealth or any other means;
23	(2) provide perinatal and postpartum care services for
24	women by telehealth or any other means, including telemonitoring;

1	(3) leverage the expertise and capacity of the
2	participating health-related institutions of higher education to
3	address urgent women's health challenges and improve the women's
4	health care system in this state; and
5	(4) enhance the state's ability to address women's
6	health care needs through collaboration of the participating
7	health-related institutions.
8	Sec. 114.052. CONSORTIUM COMPOSITION. The consortium is
9	<pre>composed of:</pre>
10	(1) the following health-related institutions of
11	higher education:
12	(A) Baylor College of Medicine;
13	(B) Texas A&M University System Health Science
14	<pre>Center;</pre>
15	(C) Texas Tech University Health Sciences
16	<pre>Center;</pre>
17	(D) Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center
18	at El Paso;
19	(E) University of North Texas Health Science
20	Center at Fort Worth;
21	(F) the Dell Medical School at The University of
22	Texas at Austin;
23	(G) The University of Texas M.D. Anderson Cancer
24	<pre>Center;</pre>
25	(H) The University of Texas Medical Branch at
26	<pre>Galveston;</pre>
27	(I) The University of Texas Health Science Center

1 at Houston; 2 (J) The University of Texas Health Science Center 3 at San Antonio; 4 (K) the School of Medicine at The University of 5 Texas Rio Grande Valley; 6 (L) The University of Texas Health Science Center 7 at Tyler; 8 (M) The University of Texas Southwestern Medical 9 Center; and 10 (N) Sam Houston State University College of Osteopathic Medicine; 11 12 (2) the commission; 13 (3) the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board; 14 (4) three nonprofit organizations that focus on 15 women's health care, designated by a majority of the members 16 described by Subdivision (1); and 17 (5) any other entity that the executive committee considers necessary. 18 19 Sec. 114.053. ADMINISTRATIVE ATTACHMENT. The consortium is administratively attached to the Texas Higher Education 20 Coordinating Board for the purpose of receiving and administering 21 appropriations and other funds under this chapter. The board is 22 not responsible for providing to the consortium personnel, human 23 resources, contract monitoring, purchasing, or any other 24 administrative support services. 25 Sec. 114.054. FUNDING. The consortium may accept and use 26

for purposes of this chapter money appropriated by the legislature

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- 1 and grants, gifts, and donations from public and private sources.
- 2 SUBCHAPTER C. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE
- 3 Sec. 114.101. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE COMPOSITION. The
- 4 consortium is governed by an executive committee composed of the
- 5 following members:
- 6 (1) the chair of the department of obstetrics and
- 7 gynecology or family medicine of each participating health-related
- 8 institution of higher education or a licensed obstetrics and
- 9 gynecology physician, family medicine physician, or maternal-fetal
- 10 medicine medical specialist designated by the chair to serve in the
- 11 chair's place;
- 12 (2) a representative of the commission with expertise
- in women's health, appointed by the executive commissioner;
- 14 (3) a representative of the Texas Higher Education
- 15 Coordinating Board, appointed by the commissioner of the
- 16 coordinating board;
- 17 (4) a representative of each nonprofit organization
- 18 described by Section 114.052(4) that is part of the consortium,
- 19 designated by a majority of the members described by Subdivision
- 20 (1); and
- 21 (5) any other representative designated by a majority
- 22 of the members described by Subdivision (1) at the request of the
- 23 <u>executive committee.</u>
- Sec. 114.102. VACANCY. A vacancy on the executive
- 25 committee shall be filled in the same manner as the original
- 26 appointment.
- Sec. 114.103. PRESIDING OFFICER. The executive committee

- 1 shall elect a presiding officer from among the membership of the
- 2 executive committee.
- 3 Sec. 114.104. GENERAL DUTIES. The executive committee
- 4 shall:
- 5 (1) develop and implement policies, procedures, and
- 6 guidelines for the operation of the consortium;
- 7 (2) oversee the administration of the consortium,
- 8 including the use of money;
- 9 (3) solicit and evaluate applications and proposals
- 10 from the participating health-related institutions of higher
- 11 education and other entities applying for grants and contracts for
- 12 research, education, and health care services related to women's
- 13 health;
- 14 (4) establish criteria for awarding grants and
- 15 contracts for research, education, and health care services related
- 16 to women's health;
- 17 (5) provide technical assistance to the participating
- 18 health-related institutions of higher education and other entities
- 19 applying for grants and contracts for research, education, and
- 20 health care services related to women's health;
- 21 (6) establish a fellowship program for obstetrics and
- 22 gynecology physicians who have completed residency and are
- 23 interested in pursuing a career in women's health, with a focus on
- 24 serving underserved areas of this state;
- 25 (7) establish a program to fund residency positions
- 26 for obstetrics and gynecology physicians, with a focus on serving
- 27 <u>underserved areas of this state;</u>

- 1 (8) provide oversight and evaluation of the fellowship
- 2 program and residency position program; and
- 3 (9) report annually to the governor, lieutenant
- 4 governor, and speaker of the house of representatives on the
- 5 activities and achievements of the consortium.
- 6 Sec. 114.105. MEETINGS. The executive committee shall meet
- 7 <u>at least quarterly or more frequently at the call of the presiding</u>
- 8 officer.
- 9 SUBCHAPTER D. WOMEN'S HEALTH GRANT PROGRAM
- Sec. 114.151. WOMEN'S HEALTH CARE EXPANSION. (a) The
- 11 executive committee may award grants to participating
- 12 health-related institutions of higher education to fund research,
- 13 education, and health care services related to women's health.
- 14 (b) The executive committee shall develop eligibility
- 15 criteria for participating institutions of higher education that
- 16 apply for grants under this section.
- 17 (c) The executive committee shall provide administrative
- 18 and technical support to a participating institution of higher
- 19 education that is awarded a grant under this section.
- Sec. 114.152. WOMEN'S HEALTH PHYSICIAN FELLOWSHIP. (a)
- 21 The executive committee may provide funding for women's health
- 22 physician fellowships, including for:
- 23 (1) obstetrics and gynecology physicians who have
- 24 completed a residency program and have a demonstrated interest in
- 25 providing women's health care services; and
- 26 (2) residency program positions for obstetrics and
- 27 gynecology physicians who have a demonstrated interest in providing

- 1 women's health care services.
- 2 (b) In awarding funding under Subsection (a), the executive
- 3 committee shall give priority to physicians serving in underserved
- 4 areas of this state.
- 5 (c) The executive committee shall develop eligibility
- 6 criteria for obstetrics and gynecology physicians applying for
- 7 <u>fellowships under this section.</u>
- 8 SUBCHAPTER E. WOMEN'S HEALTH MOBILE HEALTH CLINICS
- 9 Sec. 114.201. ESTABLISHMENT OF WOMEN'S HEALTH MOBILE HEALTH
- 10 CLINICS. The executive committee shall establish or expand
- 11 <u>existing mobile health clinics at the participating health-related</u>
- 12 institutions of higher education to provide health care services
- 13 for women in underserved areas of this state.
- 14 Sec. 114.202. REQUIREMENTS FOR MOBILE HEALTH CLINICS. Each
- 15 mobile health clinic established or expanded under this subchapter
- 16 must include licensed health care professionals, including at least
- 17 one obstetrics and gynecology or family medicine physician.
- 18 Sec. 114.203. MOBILE HEALTH CLINIC SERVICES. A mobile
- 19 health clinic established or expanded under this subchapter shall
- 20 provide preventative health care services for women, including
- 21 cancer screenings, reproductive health care services, and
- 22 immunizations in person or by using telehealth services.
- 23 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 24 of this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 25 Services Commission, the commissioner of the Texas Higher Education
- 26 Coordinating Board, and the members of the executive committee
- 27 described by Section 114.101(1), Health and Safety Code, as added

- 1 by this Act, shall make the appointments required by Section
- 2 114.101, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act.
- 3 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
