(a) In this section, "private design professional" has the meaning assigned by 10 11 Section 2252.905. 12 (b) Before the Texas Department of Transportation may make a determination under this subchapter that a private design 13 14 professional is precluded from performing a contract for architectural or engineering services or from participating in a 15 procurement for those services, the department must adopt a written 16 preclusion policy. 17 18 (c) A policy under this section must: 19 (1) be published or distributed in a manner that ensures that private design professionals in this state are aware 20 21 of the policy; 22 (2) provide that the private design professional be

notified in writing at the time the Texas Department of

Transportation determines that a potential basis for preclusion

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- 1 exists; and
- 2 (3) provide for an appeals process by which the
- 3 private design professional is given a reasonable amount of time to
- 4 establish that no basis for preclusion under the policy exists.
- 5 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 6 a contract entered into on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 7 A contract entered into before the effective date of this Act is
- 8 governed by the law in effect on the date the contract was entered
- 9 into, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
