A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to a study of existing surface water and groundwater
- 3 interaction data and analyses.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS. In this Act:
- 6 (1) "Board" means the Texas Water Development Board.
- 7 (2) "Commission" means the Texas Commission on
- 8 Environmental Quality.
- 9 SECTION 2. SURFACE WATER AND GROUNDWATER DATA ANALYSIS.
- 10 (a) The board, in cooperation with the commission, shall conduct a
- 11 study to:
- 12 (1) compile and review data and analyses from existing
- 13 studies conducted on the interaction between surface water and
- 14 groundwater in this state;
- 15 (2) identify areas of the state where there is a strong
- 16 degree of interaction between surface water and groundwater;
- 17 (3) identify areas of the state where there is a lack
- 18 of data regarding or there are inadequate models of the interaction
- 19 between surface water and groundwater; and
- 20 (4) in areas with a strong degree of interaction
- 21 between surface water and groundwater and where available data are
- 22 lacking or models are inadequate, determine a method to prioritize:
- 23 (A) additional data collection, including
- 24 streamflow gain-loss studies and long-term monitoring of

- 1 springflows; and
- 2 (B) updates of models and improvements to the
- 3 modeling of the interaction between surface water and groundwater.
- 4 (b) The board and the commission may coordinate with
- 5 groundwater conservation districts, river authorities,
- 6 governmental entities, and institutions of higher education in
- 7 compiling and reviewing existing data and analyses on the
- 8 interaction between surface water and groundwater in this state.
- 9 SECTION 3. REPORT. Not later than December 1, 2024, the
- 10 board and the commission shall deliver to the governor, the
- 11 lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives,
- 12 and each member of the legislature a report summarizing the
- 13 findings and recommendations of the board and the commission based
- 14 on the study conducted under Section 2 of this Act.
- 15 SECTION 4. EXPIRATION. This Act expires January 1, 2025.
- 16 SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 17 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- 18 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 19 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 20 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
