- 2 relating to the renewal of certain expired certificates issued by
- 3 the Texas Commission on Fire Protection; authorizing a fee.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 419.0341, Government Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsection (e) and adding Subsection (e-1) to read as
- 7 follows:
- 8 (e) If the person's certificate has been expired for \underline{more}
- 9 than five years [one year or longer], the person may not renew the
- 10 certificate. The person may obtain a new certificate by submitting
- 11 to the proficiency examination or repeating the requirements and
- 12 procedures for obtaining an original certificate. The commission
- 13 shall charge a fee to cover the cost of administering the
- 14 proficiency examination.
- 15 (e-1) If the person's certificate has been expired for more
- 16 than one year but not more than five years, the person may renew the
- 17 certificate in accordance with rules established by the commission.
- 18 The commission by rule shall establish:
- 19 (1) a system for renewing a certificate under this
- 20 <u>subsection;</u>
- 21 (2) a list of criteria a person must satisfy to renew a
- 22 <u>certificate under this subsection; and</u>
- 23 (3) a fee for renewing a certificate under this
- 24 subsection.

- 1 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 2 a certificate that expires in accordance with rules adopted by the
- 3 Texas Commission on Fire Protection under Section 419.033,
- 4 Government Code, on or after January 1, 2024. A certificate that
- 5 expires before January 1, 2024, is governed by the law in effect
- 6 immediately before the effective date of this Act, and the former
- 7 law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 8 SECTION 3. Not later than January 1, 2024, the Texas
- 9 Commission on Fire Protection shall adopt rules providing for the
- 10 renewal of a certificate under Section 419.0341(e-1), Government
- 11 Code, as added by this Act.
- 12 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
