## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the improper use and treatment of an assistance animal

- 3 or service animal; increasing a criminal penalty.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 121.006, Human Resources Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 121.006. [PENALTIES FOR] IMPROPER USE OF ASSISTANCE
- 8 AND SERVICE ANIMALS; OFFENSE. (a) A person commits an offense if
- 9 the person intentionally or knowingly represents [who uses a
- 10 service animal with a harness or leash of the type commonly used by
- 11 persons with disabilities who use trained animals, in order to
- 12 represent] that an [his or her] animal is an assistance animal or a
- 13 [specially trained] service animal when the animal is not specially
- 14 trained or equipped to help a person with a disability. An offense
- 15 under this subsection [ $\frac{\text{training has not in fact been provided}_{r}$ ] is
- 16 [guilty of] a misdemeanor punishable [and on conviction shall be
- 17 punished] by:
- 18 (1) a fine of not more than \$1,000 [\\$300]; and
- 19 (2) 30 hours of community service to be performed for a
- 20 governmental entity or nonprofit organization that primarily
- 21 serves persons with visual impairments or other disabilities, or
- 22 for another entity or organization at the discretion of the court,
- 23 to be completed in not more than one year.
- (b) A person who habitually abuses or neglects to feed or

- 2 assistance animal or service animal is subject to seizure of the
- 3 animal under Subchapter B, Chapter 821, Health and Safety Code.
- 4 SECTION 2. Section 121.006(a), Human Resources Code, as
- 5 amended by this Act, applies only to an offense committed on or
- 6 after the effective date of this Act. An offense committed before
- 7 the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect when
- 8 the offense was committed, and the former law is continued in effect
- 9 for that purpose. For purposes of this section, an offense was
- 10 committed before the effective date of this Act if any element of
- 11 the offense occurred before that date.
- 12 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
