- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 38.0101, Education Code, is amended to 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 38.0101. [AUTHORITY TO EMPLOY OR CONTRACT WITH]
- 8 NONPHYSICIAN MENTAL HEALTH PROFESSIONALS [PROFESSIONAL]. (a) A
- 9 school district shall [may] employ or contract with one or more
- 10 nonphysician mental health professionals to provide services at
- 11 each district campus. A school district must provide at least one
- 12 nonphysician mental health professional for every 600 students at
- 13 <u>each campus</u>.
- 14 (b) A nonphysician mental health professional providing
- 15 services under this section shall implement a comprehensive mental
- 16 health program for the campus the professional serves and spend at
- 17 least 80 percent of the professional's total work time providing
- 18 direct or indirect mental health services to students. The
- 19 commissioner shall adopt rules as necessary to administer this
- 20 <u>subsection</u>.
- 21 (c) In this section, "nonphysician mental health
- 22 professional" means:
- 23 (1) a psychologist licensed to practice in this state
- 24 and designated as a health-service provider;

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- 1 (2) a registered nurse with a master's or doctoral
- 2 degree in psychiatric nursing;
- 3 (3) a licensed clinical social worker;
- 4 (4) a professional counselor licensed to practice in
- 5 this state; or
- 6 (5) a marriage and family therapist licensed to
- 7 practice in this state.
- 8 (d) Each school district must demonstrate to the agency
- 9 compliance with this section not later than August 1, 2025. This
- 10 subsection expires August 1, 2026.
- 11 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
