1 AN ACT 2 relating to municipally owned utility vegetation management. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Subchapter Z, Chapter 552, Local Government 4 5 Code, is amended by adding Section 552.915 to read as follows: 6 Sec. 552.915. PROHIBITION ON TRANSFER OF MUNICIPAL UTILITY REVENUE. (a) In this section: 7 (1) "Commission" means the Public Utility Commission 8 9 of Texas. (2) "Municipal utility" means an electric utility 10 system owned, operated, or controlled by a municipality. 11 12 (b) If the commission determines under Section 38.101, Utilities Code, that a municipal utility's vegetation management 13 activities are insufficient to ensure reliable service, except as 14 provided by Subsection (c) and notwithstanding any other law, the 15 municipality may not in the fiscal year of the determination 16 transfer revenue to the general fund of the municipality from the 17 municipal utility that the municipal utility needs to conduct 18 sufficient vegetation management activities to ensure reliable 19 20 service. 21 (c) The commission shall provide the municipality with a reasonable grace period after the commission provides a notice to 22 23 the municipal utility under Section 38.101(c), Utilities Code, in which the municipality may continue to transfer revenue as

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1	described by Subsection (b) while the utility alters the utility's
2	vegetation management activities to ensure reliable service.
3	SECTION 2. Section 38.101, Utilities Code, is amended to

5	Sec. 38.101. REPORT ON INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENT AND
6	MAINTENANCE. (a) Not later than May 1 of each year, each electric
7	utility and municipally owned utility shall submit to the
8	commission a report describing the utility's activities related to:
9	(1) identifying areas that are susceptible to damage
10	during severe weather and hardening transmission and distribution
11	facilities in those areas;
12	(2) vegetation management; and
13	(3) inspecting distribution poles.
14	(b) Each electric utility and municipally owned utility
15	shall include in a report required under Subsection (a) a summary of
16	the utility's activities related to preparing for emergency
17	operations.
18	(c) The commission shall evaluate each report submitted by a
19	municipally owned utility under this section and notify the utility
20	if the commission determines that the utility's vegetation
21	management activities are insufficient to ensure reliable service.
22	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
