5	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 1304, Occupations Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 1304.0051 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 1304.0051. CONFIDENTIALITY OF CERTAIN INFORMATION.
8	(a) The following information submitted to or maintained by the
9	department under this chapter that pertains to an applicant for
10	registration or a seller, provider, or administrator is
11	confidential and not subject to disclosure under Chapter 552,
12	Government Code:
13	(1) the financial condition of the applicant, seller,
14	<pre>provider, or administrator;</pre>
15	(2) the identity or number of service contract
16	holders; or
17	(3) documents that are claimed, in a manner determined
18	by the department, proprietary or confidential for competitive

(b) The department may withhold the information described

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- 1 (b) Ιf the provider ensures its obligations under Subsection (a)(2), the amount maintained in the reserve account may 2 3 not be less than an amount computed by subtracting the amount of any claims paid from the product of [equal to] 40 percent and [ef] the 4 5 gross consideration the provider received from consumers from the sale of all service contracts issued and outstanding in this state 6 [ minus any claims paid ]. The department shall prescribe a 7 8 calculation form to be used by a provider to calculate the minimum amount required to be maintained in the provider's reserve account 9 10 under this subsection. The executive director may review and examine the reserve account. Except as provided by Subsections 11 (b-1) and (b-4), the amount of the security deposit may not be less 12 than \$250,000. The provider must submit to the executive director 13 14 on request a copy of the provider's financial statements that must 15 be prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, be without qualification as to the going concern status 16 17 of the provider, and be audited by an independent certified public accountant. The commission by rule may require the provider to 18 submit additional financial reports. 19
- 20 SECTION 3. Section 1304.157(c), Occupations Code, is 21 amended to read as follows:
- (c) Notwithstanding Section 1304.151(a)(1), a provider of a residential service contract may use a reimbursement insurance policy issued by a captive insurance company as defined by Section 964.001, Insurance Code, to insure the provider's residential service contracts if the provider maintains a funded reserve equal to not less than an amount computed by subtracting the amount of any

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- 1 claims paid from the product of 25 percent and [of] the gross consideration the provider received from consumers from the sale of 2 3 all the provider's service contracts issued and outstanding in this state [, minus any claims paid]. The department shall prescribe a 4 calculation form to be used by a provider to calculate the minimum 5 amount required to be maintained in the provider's reserve account 6 under this subsection. A reimbursement insurance policy issued to 7 8 a residential service contract provider in accordance with this subsection: 9
- 10 (1) is not subject to Section 1304.152; and
- is considered to satisfy the requirements of 11 (2) Sections 1304.1025 and 1304.151(a)(1) for purposes of this chapter. 12 SECTION 4. Notwithstanding Section 4.13(b), Chapter 663 13 14 (H.B. 1560), Acts of the 87th Legislature, Regular Session, 2021, a 15 license issued by the Texas Real Estate Commission under former Chapter 1303, Occupations Code, before September 1, 2021, is 16 17 continued in effect until January 1, 2024, as a provider administrator registration issued by the Texas Department 18 19 Licensing and Regulation under Chapter 1304, Occupations Code.
- SECTION 5. Any information designated as confidential for 20 competitive purposes under former Chapter 1303, Occupations Code, 21 by an applicant, seller, provider, or administrator before the 22 effective date of this Act is confidential and not subject to 23 24 disclosure under Chapter 552, Government Code. Department of Licensing and Regulation may withhold the information 25 26 without requesting a decision from the attorney general under Subchapter G, Chapter 552, Government Code. 27

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1 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
