10	compensatory time off at the rate of one hour for each hour worked
11	on the holiday:
12	(1) an employee of the Department of Family and
13	Protective Services in the statewide intake division who receives
14	reports of abuse or neglect;
15	(2) [a state employee who is] a peace officer
16	commissioned by a state officer or state agency listed under
17	Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure;
18	(3) an employee of the Department of Public Safety
19	who:
20	(A) performs [, or who is employed by the
21	Department of Public Safety either to perform] communications or
22	dispatch services related to traffic law enforcement; or
23	(B) is [or as] a public security officer, as that
24	term is defined by Section 1701.001, Occupations Code; or

- 1 (4) an employee of the Parks and Wildlife Department
 2 who performs [, or who is employed by the Parks and Wildlife
 3 Department to perform] communications and dispatch services to
 4 assist law enforcement officers commissioned by the Parks and
 5 Wildlife Commission in performing law enforcement duties [, and who
 6 is required to work on a national or state holiday that falls on a
 7 Saturday or Sunday is entitled to compensatory time off at the rate
 8 of one hour for each hour worked on the holiday].
