- Code, is amended by adding Section 161.01095 to read as follows: 6
- 7 Sec. 161.01095. PROHIBITED DISCRIMINATION BASED ON
- VACCINATION STATUS. (a) In this section, "health care provider" 8
- 9 means an individual or facility licensed, certified, or otherwise
- authorized to administer health care, for profit or otherwise, in 10
- the ordinary course of business or professional practice. The term 11
- includes a physician. 12
- (b) In this section, "COVID-19" means the 2019 novel 13
- coronavirus disease. 14
- (c) Notwithstanding any other law, a health care provider 15
- 16 may not, based on an individual's COVID-19 vaccination status or
- post-transmission recovery of COVID-19, deny or refuse to provide 17
- the individual a health care treatment, procedure, or service. 18
- 19 (d) The Texas Medical Board or another state regulatory
- agency with jurisdiction over a health care provider subject to 20
- this section shall revoke the license, certification, or 21
- authorization of a physician or health care provider who the board 22
- 23 or agency determines has violated this section.
- 24 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
