5	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 37, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 37.0818 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 37.0818. PRIVATE SCHOOL PEACE OFFICERS. (a) This
8	section applies only to a private school that has an enrollment of
9	at least 1,500 students.
10	(b) The governing body of a private school to which this
11	section applies may commission peace officers to enforce state and
12	local law on a campus of the school.
13	(c) A peace officer commissioned by a private school under
14	this section must meet all minimum standards for peace officers
15	established by the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement.
16	SECTION 2. Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
17	amended to read as follows:
18	Art. 2.12. WHO ARE PEACE OFFICERS. The following are peace
19	officers:
20	(1) sheriffs, their deputies, and those reserve
21	deputies who hold a permanent peace officer license issued under
22	Chapter 1701, Occupations Code;

11 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
