H.B. No. 4375

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to instruction in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and the 3 use of an automated external defibrillator in public schools. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Section 7.026, Education Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 Sec. 7.026. DONATIONS FOR USE RELATED TO CARDIOPULMONARY 7 RESUSCITATION (CPR) AND AUTOMATED EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATOR (AED) 8 9 INSTRUCTION. SECTION 2. Section 7.026(a), Education Code, is amended to 10 11 read as follows: 12 (a) The agency may accept donations, including donations of equipment, for use in providing *instruction in* cardiopulmonary 13 14 resuscitation (CPR) and the use of an automated external defibrillator (AED) [instruction] to students. The agency: 15 shall distribute the donations to school districts 16 (1)for the purpose of providing CPR and AED instruction to students 17 under Sections 28.0023 and 29.903; and 18 (2) may use a portion of the donations to the extent 19 necessary to pay administrative expenses related to the donations. 20 21 SECTION 3. Section 28.0023, Education Code, is amended by amending Subsections (b), (c), (e), and (g) and adding Subsection 22 23 (h) to read as follows: (b) The State Board of Education by rule shall require 24

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1 instruction in cardiopulmonary resuscitation <u>and the use of an</u> 2 <u>automated external defibrillator</u>, for students in grades 7 through 3 12.

4 (c) A school district or open-enrollment charter school 5 shall provide instruction to students in grades 7 through 12 in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and the use of an automated external 6 defibrillator in a manner consistent with the requirements of this 7 8 section and State Board of Education rules adopted under this section. The instruction may be provided as a part of any course. A 9 10 student shall receive the instruction at least once before graduation. 11

12 (e) Cardiopulmonary resuscitation instruction must include 13 training <u>in cardiopulmonary resuscitation techniques and the use of</u> 14 <u>an automated external defibrillator</u> that has been developed:

15 (1) by the American Heart Association or the American16 Red Cross; or

17 (2) using nationally recognized, evidence-based
18 guidelines for emergency cardiovascular care and incorporating
19 psychomotor skills to support the instruction.

20 (g) A school district or open-enrollment charter school may use emergency medical technicians, paramedics, police officers, 21 firefighters, representatives of the American Heart Association or 22 the American Red Cross, teachers, other school employees, or other 23 24 similarly qualified individuals to provide instruction and training under this section. Instruction provided under this 25 26 section is not required to result in certification in cardiopulmonary resuscitation or the use of an automated external 27

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1 defibrillator. If instruction is intended to result in certification in cardiopulmonary resuscitation or the use of an 2 3 automated external defibrillator, the course instructor must be authorized to provide the instruction by the American Heart 4 Association, the American Red Cross, or a similar nationally 5 recognized association. 6

7 (h) From funds appropriated or otherwise available for the 8 purpose, the commissioner shall develop and award grants to school 9 districts and open-enrollment charter schools to assist the 10 district or school in providing the instruction required by this 11 section.

SECTION 4. The heading to Section 29.903, Education Code, is amended to read as follows:

14Sec. 29.903. CARDIOPULMONARYRESUSCITATION (CPR)AND15AUTOMATED EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATOR (AED)INSTRUCTION; DONATIONS TO16SCHOOL DISTRICTS FOR USE IN CPRAND AEDINSTRUCTION.

SECTION 5. Sections 29.903(a) and (c), Education Code, are amended to read as follows:

(a) A school district may accept from the agency donations the agency receives under Section 7.026 for use in providing instruction to students in the principles and techniques of CPR <u>and</u> the use of an AED. A district may accept other donations, including donations of equipment, for use in providing the instruction.

(c) A district may use resources other than those made
 available under Section 7.026 or this section to provide
 instruction to students in the principles and techniques of CPR and

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1 the use of an AED.

2 SECTION 6. This Act applies beginning with the 2023-2024 3 school year.

4 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 5 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 6 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 7 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 8 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
