- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subtitle F, Title 2, Education Code, is amended
- 6 by adding Chapter 35 to read as follows:
- 7 CHAPTER 35. CONTENT RATINGS FOR BOOKS AND OTHER WRITTEN MATERIALS
- 8 Sec. 35.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "board" means
- 9 the State Board of Education.
- 10 Sec. 35.002. CONTENT RATINGS REQUIRED. (a) A publisher may
- 11 not sell a book or other written material to a school district or
- 12 <u>open-enrollment charter school unless the publisher has:</u>
- (1) assigned a content rating as provided by this
- 14 section to the book or material; and
- 15 (2) affixed to the cover of the book or material a
- 16 label indicating the content rating assigned under Subdivision (1).
- 17 (b) A publisher shall assign the content rating "BK-Y" to a
- 18 book or material that is intended for children younger than seven
- 19 years of age. "BK-Y" rated content may not be designed or intended
- 20 to frighten.
- 21 (c) A publisher shall assign the content rating "BK-Y7" to a
- 22 book or material that is intended for children seven years of age or
- 23 older. "BK-Y7" rated content may contain mildly frightening or
- 24 violent themes.

- 1 (d) A publisher shall assign the content rating "BK-G" to a
- 2 book or material that is intended for all ages. "BK-G" rated
- 3 content may contain little or no violent, sexual, or profane
- 4 themes.
- 5 (e) A publisher shall assign the content rating "BK-PG" to a
- 6 book or material that is intended to be read by young children only
- 7 with the guidance of an adult. "BK-PG" rated content may contain
- 8 suggestive dialogue or situations, infrequent profanity, and
- 9 moderate violence.
- 10 (f) A publisher shall assign the content rating "BK-14" to a
- 11 book or material that is intended to be read by children 14 years of
- 12 age or older. "BK-14" rated content may contain intensely
- 13 suggestive dialogue or situations, profanity, and intense
- 14 violence.
- 15 (g) A publisher shall assign the content rating "BK-MA" to a
- 16 book or material that is intended for persons 17 years of age or
- 17 older. "BK-MA" rated content may contain explicit depictions of
- 18 sexuality, strong profanity, and graphic violence.
- 19 (h) Not later than September 1, 2024, each publisher shall
- 20 develop and submit to the board a list of each book or other written
- 21 material sold by the publisher to a school district or
- 22 open-enrollment charter school before that date. The list must
- 23 include the title of the book or material and the content rating
- 24 assigned to that book or material.
- 25 (i) The board shall post each list submitted under
- 26 Subsection (h) on the board's Internet website as soon as
- 27 practicable.

- 1 Sec. 35.003. CONTENT RATING RESTRICTIONS. A school
- 2 district or open-enrollment charter school may not use as
- 3 instructional material or make available:
- 4 (1) for students in a grade level below grade six, a
- 5 book or material rated BK-PG, BK-14, or BK-MA; or
- 6 (2) for students in a grade level below grade nine, a
- 7 book or material rated BK-14 or BK-MA.
- 8 Sec. 35.004. STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION REVIEW. (a) The
- 9 board may review a content rating assigned by a publisher to a book
- 10 or other written material under Section 35.002. If the board
- 11 disagrees with a content rating assigned by a publisher, the board
- 12 shall provide written notice to the publisher. The notice must
- 13 include:
- 14 (1) the content rating the board would assign to the
- 15 book or material; and
- 16 (2) information regarding the publisher's duty under
- 17 this section.
- 18 (b) Not later than the 120th day after the date on which a
- 19 publisher receives notice for a book or other written material
- 20 under Subsection (a), the publisher shall:
- 21 <u>(1) either:</u>
- 22 (A) change the content rating for the book or
- 23 material to the content rating that the board would assign, as
- 24 stated in the notice; or
- 25 (B) cease all sales of the book or material to a
- 26 school district or open-enrollment charter school and issue a
- 27 recall for all copies of the book or material sold to a school

- 1 district or open-enrollment charter school; and
- 2 (2) notify the board of the action taken under
- 3 Subdivision (1).
- 4 (c) The board shall maintain on the board's Internet website
- 5 a list of publishers who fail to comply with Subsection (b).
- 6 (d) A school district or open-enrollment charter school may
- 7 not purchase a book or other written material from a publisher on
- 8 the list described by Subsection (c).
- 9 (e) A publisher placed on the list described by Subsection
- 10 (c) may petition the board for removal from the list. The board may
- 11 remove a publisher from the list only if the board is satisfied that
- 12 the publisher has taken appropriate action under Subsection (b).
- 13 Sec. 35.005. LIABILITY. A school district or
- 14 open-enrollment charter school is not liable for any claim or
- 15 damage resulting from a publisher's violation of this chapter.
- Sec. 35.006. RULES. The board may adopt rules as necessary
- 17 to administer this chapter.
- SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2024-2025
- 19 school year.
- 20 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 21 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 22 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 23 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 24 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
